This Agreement, made and entered into at Klamath Falls, Oregon, this 1st day of November, A. D. 1924 by and between the County of Klamath, by its duly authorized County Court, party of the first part, and H. F. Vicory, party of the second part.
Witnesseth, first party has heretofore, on the 27th day of September, 1924, accepted the bid of second party for the grading of approximately five miles of the Market Road from Chiloquin to the Dalles-California Highway, about one mile north of the Williamson River bridge, in Klamath County, Oregon, said road being designated as the Chiloquin-Williamson River Market road; and
Whereas, the "Advertisement, specifications and form of proposal," together with such bid made by second party and accepted by first party are now on file with the County Clerk of Klamath County, Oregon specifying the work to be done and in detail specifying the manner of performance thereof, which said work includes clearing, grading, excavating, and the placing of drainage culverts:
Now therefore, in consideration of the covenants of the respective parties hereto it is hereby
Mutually Agreed, that second party will clear, grade, excavate and place drainage culverts in said five miles of the Chiloquin-Williamson River Market road; that he will perform said work strictly in accordance with said advertisement, specifications and form of proposal on file in the office of the county clerk of Klamath County, and that he will complete said work within one hundred working days from said 27th day of September, 1924.
