COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Friday, January 2nd, 1925. Court met pursuant to adjournment, all members being present, when the following proceedings were had: In the matter of Tax levies for the year 1925. This matter came on at this time in pursuance to publication of budget for the year 1925, this being the day set for meeting to discuss the 1925 Tax levies on the 1924 Tax Rolls. Same was on this day continued until Saturday, January 3rd, 1925. This agreement, made and entered into at Klamath Falls, Oregon, this 2 day of January, 1925, by and between the County Court, for and on behalf of Klamath County, party of the first part, and Tom Tracy, of said City, party of the second part. Witnesseth: Whereas, while second party was in the employ of Klamath County, Oregon, on the

5th day of July, 1924, in the capacity of Court House Janitor, he was severely injured in the foot by the accidental discharge of a gun in the hands of a guard of the jail also in the employ of said County; and Whereas, the parties hereto desire, and have agreed to settle the claims and controversies arising, or that may grow out of the aforesaid injury; Now therefore, it is hereby mutually agreed by the parties hereto, that the County of Klamath shall and will pay to second party the lump sum of Five Hundred forty (\$540) Dollars, such payment to be in consideration of the full release of said County by the second party on account of said injury. And in consideration of such payment of said sum, the second party hereto expressly acknowledges full satisfaction and compensation for said injury, and hereby releases and exonerates the said Klamath County and the said County Court, and any and all of their agents or employees, from any and all claim for damages or compensation on account of said injury of second party as said July 5th, 1924, it being expressly understood and agreed that this settlement shall and does cover all damages heretofore resulting from said injury, as well as all claims for damages that may hereafter arise on account thereof. High School Fund— It appearing to the Court that it will be necessary to raise the sum of \$56,718.27 for High School purposes. It is therefore hereby Ordered, and there is hereby levied on all the taxable property of Klamath County, a tax of 2.30 mills on
