"Smouldering Fires," Universal-Jewel-Clarence Brown production coming to the Pine Tree Theatre next Thursday and Friday, has a particularly notable cast for it co-stars Pauline Fderleck and Laura La Plante, has Malcolm McGregor as leading man, and Tully Marshall, Wanda Hawley and Helen Lynch in prominent parts.

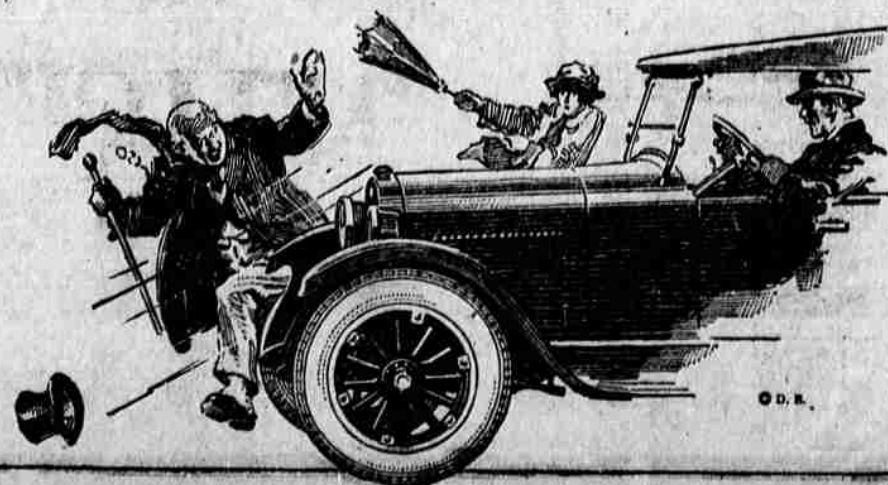
