CONTRACT This agreement, made and entered into this 8th day of January, 1925, between Klamath County, Oregon, through R. H. Bunnell, County Judge, and B. W. Short and C. J. Martin, acting as Commissioners in and for said County, of the first part, and Dave Edgar, R. F. Edgar and J. E. Cullison, as parties doing business under the firm name of Edgar & Cullison, of Portland, Oregon, of the second part.

Witnesseth: That for the consideration hereinafter provided to be made and paid the second party by the first party, the said second party hereby covenants, contracts and agrees: That they will make and complete a cruise of the timber situated on such lands in Klamath County, Oregon, as may be designated by the first party between this date and September 1st, 1925.

The first party agrees that it will designate not less than seventy five thousand (75,000) acres of land to be cruised under the terms of this contract and will furnish written notice to the second party a legal description of said lands on or before Thirty (30) days from this date, provided nevertheless, that first party shall have the option to designate more than 75,000 acres to be cruised under the terms of this contract, but in case additional lands are designated by first party such designation of additional lands shall be made in writing and furnished to second party not later than June 1st, 1925.

That upon said cruise being made from time to time, the second party hereby agrees to file reports of such cruise; said reports to contain maps showing elevations taken by means of aneroid barometers; said reports to show openings, clearings, burns, marshes, rivers, lakes, creeks, trails and other topographical features observed by cruisers; said reports to include a general description of the character of all lands cruised, describing its adaptability for agricultural, grazing or other purposes after the timber is removed; said reports to describe the character of the different varieties of timber, giving the average stump diameter, the average number of sixteen (16) foot logs per tree, and also describe logging conditions; said reports also to show damage by fire or otherwise.

Hot bed ashes are not so expensive these days, but that the Oregon gardener can well afford to use them in his gardening work, says the expert station. date of receipt by second party of written notice designating the lands to be cruised as provided in Paragraph I of this contract, and no money or warrants shall be paid or delivered to the second party under this contract until such bond shall be filed, and approved by the first party.

IV In consideration of the true and faithful performance by the second party of the terms and conditions of this contract on their part required to be done and performed the first party agrees to pay to the second party or to their order or assigns a sum equal to twenty cents (\$20) per acre for all lands cruised and reported on by said second party as follows: at each regular term of County Court, the first party will issue to the second party or to their order or assigns, County warrants for the amount due the second party as shown by the reports prior to that date.

V It is further agreed by and between the parties hereto that in case of objections being made within one year of date of completion of cruise by timber owners as to the amount of merchantable timber reported by the party of the second part and shown by their cruise upon any of the lands in said county no ordered cruised by this contract, the County Court of Klamath County, Oregon, may, if it deems advisable, order the party of the second part to recruise such tract or tracts, provided the objector or objectors will also furnish a good and reliable cruiser to accompany the cruiser of the party of the second part in such recruise, and in such case the second parties covenant that they will recruise the timber shown on said lands in company with the cruiser provided by such objector or objectors, and if such recruise is found to be ten (10) per cent or more under the original cruise then the party of the second part must pay the expenses of said recruise, including the expenses of the cruiser furnished by the objector or objectors, but in such recruise does not show that said tract or tracts so objected to, have been over-cruised ten (10) per cent or more, then the objector or objectors must pay the expense of said recruise entirely. And the County Court shall make such provisions for the expenses as in its judgment shall be deemed advisable before such recruise is ordered.

In witness whereof, the parties hereto have caused these presents to be executed in duplicate copies, the first party, Klamath County, by its County Judge and County Commissioners, pursuant to an order of the County Court heretofore duly adopted and passed authorizing the execution of this instrument, together with the seal of said County, and the second party, all done the day and year first above written.
