ROAD RE-LOCATION POSTPONED AGAIN

Through intercession of interests in Klamath county, the state highway commission has been prevailed upon to postpone their decision on the routing of the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway from Dairy east, it was learned today.

According to reports, the state highway commission will make final decision in the routing of the road the latter part of this month.

The routing of the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway has aroused much interest in Bonanza, Dairy and Beatty. The two routes proposed are (1) From Dairy to Bonanza and then to Beatty; (2) From Dairy direct to Beatty. It is known that the Dairy-Beatty route is the shortest but on the other hand a road has been built from Dairy to Bonanza.
