## HOOP SEASON NEARING END

**Klamath High Team to Meet Henley Tonight at Malin in Fast Contest**

Nearing the end of the Klamath county basketball season, the Klamath county high team will journey to Malin tonight, where it will meet the fast Henley team in the last game between these two teams until 1926 again ushers in another basketball season. A large number of rooters is expected to accompany the men, special buses having been provided.

Captain Gus Carlson has picked his team. Those taking forward positions are Beckley and Barnes; for guards, Molatore and Hall, and Dale Soule will occupy the pivot

position. Newsom, Carroll and Graham will be taken as subs.

There are yet two more games to be played before the final decision as to whom is entitled to the county cup. The game between Merrill and Klamath will be played next week, this contest being the most decisive of the season. If Klamath county high teamers send the Merrill men down on their own floor, it means that the Klamath boys are entitled to keep the county cup permanently, having won it the two previous years. Merrill is rated 100 per cent and the boys are having to submit to strenuous skull as well as field practice. The game between Klamath Agency will terminate the season for Klamath boys.

Need of gymnasium facilities is felt by women just as much as men according to athletic authorities in this city and a meeting of representatives of women's organizations has been called for next Tuesday evening at which a plan will be evolved whereby women may use the new gym at the Scandinavian hall exclusively for two or three evenings each week.

Following are the representatives of various clubs who will attend the meeting: Mrs. R. E. Waitenburgh, American Association of University Women; Miss Vera Houston, P. E. O.; Mrs. E. L. Oramblitt, Library club; Miss Alice Blackford, Fairview Parent-Teachers' association. Miss Florence Ollman, teacher at Fairview school, who has had much experience in physical culture, would probably be the instructor of the girls, it was said.

### POPULATION NOW PLACED AT 8000

Based on the usual computation of four persons to every obid of school age, Klamath Falls now has a population of about 8000 persons,

J. P. Wells, superintendent of the city schools, told the Kiwanis club yesterday noon. Even this estimate was considered low by Mr. Wells, due to the large transient population of Klamath that ebbs and flows during the different seasons of the year. The number of school children from four years of age to 20 years is 2000, Mr. Wells said.

Mr. Wells outlined the present status of city schools and told of the new Central school which will soon be built at Seventh and High streets. Bonds for the school sold at a premium, the superintendent said, and final plans are being drawn up pending the letting of the contract.
