Alleys Will Be Purged of Trash By Street Dept.

Active measures are being taken by the city street department, under the direction of Street Commissioner J. E. Franey, to clean all dedicated alleys between Klamath avenue and Pine street and from Second street to Eleventh street, of refuse and trash piles.

The move was initiated partly because of the sanitary hazards incurred by the trash piles and partly because of the necessity of opening up the alleys to vehicular traffic. Mr. Franey said today.

Merchants who are responsible for any refuse dumps behind their business houses will be notified to clean them out.

Inclement weather of the past several days has made it impossible for the street department to further grading and scraping operations on dirt streets. Last week the activities of the department were devoted almost exclusively to this work, but snow, with its usual result of muddy roads, has made it impossible to keep up the work. With sunshiny spring weather maintenance work will be continued. Main arteries of vehicular traffic will be scraped and smoothed first.

The street commissioner stated that trash piles on lower Plum street and adjacent streets would be taken away and the streets made suitable for automobile traffic.

Men Craziest but Also Brightest Is Statistical Dope

BERLIN, March 10.—Germany, a local daily with a love for statistics, has collected a lot of figures on German population from which it derives authority for the following statements: Ten out of every 1,000 men and three out of every 1,000 women are idiots. On the other hand, out of 1,000 men there are 10 geniuses, whereas among 1,000 women there are none.

When it comes to average intelligence, the women are ahead, 595 out of 1,000 being in that category, while only 380 out of 1,000 men thus qualify.

Bids for New School to Be Called in Few Days

Bids for the construction of the new Central school will be advertised in about 10 days, according to a decision reached last night at a meeting of the city school board. The building will be erected on the site of the present Episcopal church, and will consist of 14 rooms, according to present plans.

Preliminary specifications are practically completed and will be available for the study of architects and contractors by the latter part of the week to be used as a guide in submitting bids for the erection of the structure.

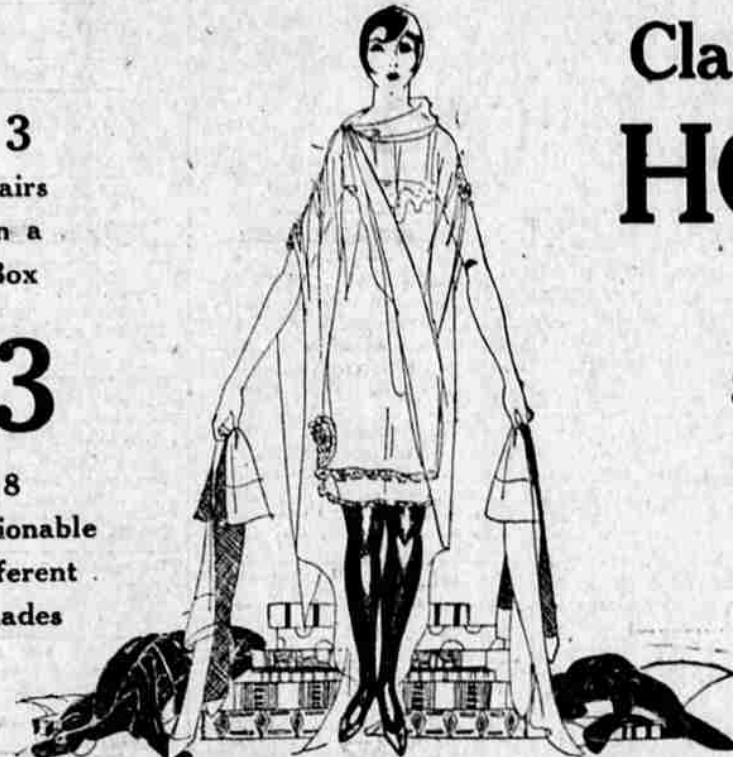

COW TEST ASSOCIATIONS FAST GAINING IN FAVOR

"Interest in Oregon cow testing associations is increasing," reports N. C. Jamison, dairyman of the college extension service. "Rouge River association began testing the first of this year and two associations are being organized in Coos county."

Results encourage testing. For January 2399 cows were tested in seven associations, with 15 detected as oafers and killed. The average production was 606 pounds of milk with 25.3 pounds of fat. Of the cows tested, 253 produced 40 or more pounds of fat. The best herds in each of the seven associations were as follows:

Tillamook No. 1, G. A. Schild, averaged 41.46 pounds of fat; No. 2, William Glick, 30.01; No. 3, Joe Grab, 34.60; Columbia, Lee Kerpella, 67.5; Redmond, herd No. 0, 43.38; Union, W. W. Langford, 39.6; Rouge River, W. Bohnert, 42.26.

The highest honor prize cow belongs to G. H. Anliker of Columbia association, a Holstein that gave 1826 pounds of milk with 89.4 pounds of fat. The highest grade producer is owned by J.

Dowling of the same association and gave 847 pounds of milk with 47 pounds of fat.

"Reports indicate that butter substitutes have decreased in sales in recent months," says Mr. Jamison, "and that exports of butter from this country have increased. Such conditions should tend to decrease storage stocks with the result that markets should get on a firmer basis. The amount of milk production this spring will also have an effect."
