## MUCH INTEREST AROUSED OVER TRACK MEET

All elementary and secondary schools of Klamath county will be asked to enter teams in the annual track meet to be held at the county fair grounds, Klamath Falls, Saturday, May 9. This is the second year of the county meet, and the first year that all schools in the county will be urged to participate. The meet will be known as the "Klamath County Track and Field Meet."

With the facilities that the fair grounds offer, with the date set for Saturday before any of the schools of the county have closed, and with nearly all, if not all, of the schools entering teams, the meet should be largely attended from all parts of the county. This bringing together of the various grade schools and high schools will go far, it is hoped, toward raising the spirit of rivalry among the schools to a higher level. It is also hoped that an increased interest in the schools and in education in general will be a result.

Details of the meet have not yet been worked out, but at the meeting of school principals, Saturday, March 7, a skeleton outline of the meet was agreed upon, and committees appointed to work out the details. A second meeting of the principals has been scheduled for Saturday, March 21. Following this meeting a letter will go out to all the schools announcing the meet, listing the various events in both field and track, and urging the schools to enter teams.

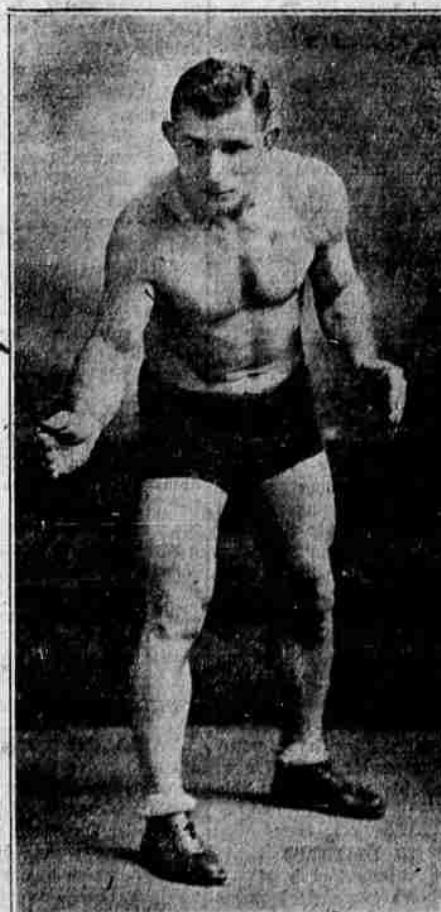

An attempt will also be made to arrange for family tickets so that father, mother and all the children may at-

tend the meet rather than be discouraged from attending by a prohibitive admittance charge.
