Sacred Heart Academy Will Give Recital at White Pelican March 24

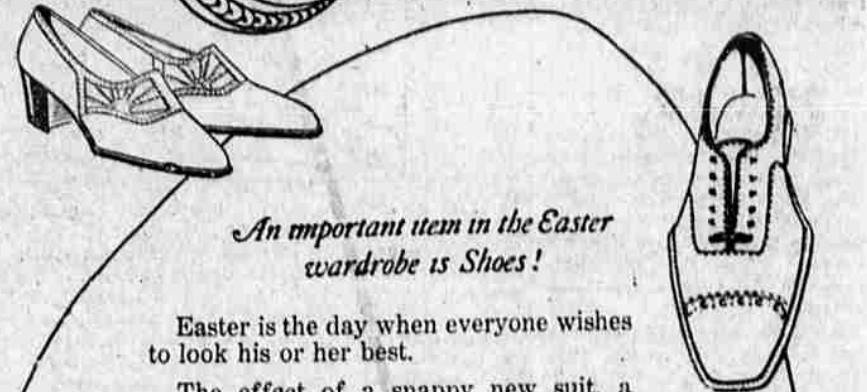
Members of the senior class of the Sacred Heart academy will present their annual musical recital on the evening of March 24 at the White Pelican hotel, according to announcement made today.

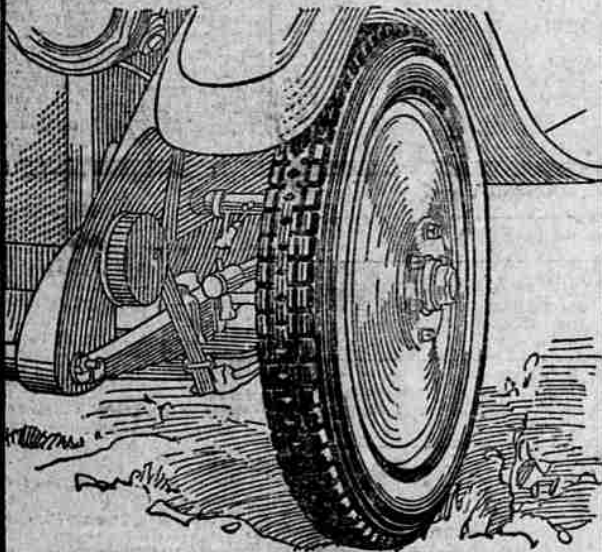

GOOD YEAR FOR MODOC COUNTY

Heavy rains and snows which filled reservoirs with water and which have given assurance of an abundance of range grass indicate a more prosperous year in Modoc county, California, during 1925 than 1924, is the prediction today of Deputy County Assessor John Davis of Modoc county.

"While the prices for cattle are not high, there is a demand that keeps livestock moving toward the market," Mr. Davis said. The assessor was in town today with Maurice Johnson, deputy assessor of Klamath county.

"We have been enjoying an abundance of rainfall and snow and reservoirs in different sections of the county are now full. Last year our main trouble was lack of water. Take Surprise valley and Big valley, that were dry last year, as examples. These two valleys will have enough water to last them through the summer, according to present indications."

Owing to the continual movement of livestock from Klamath county into Modoc county and visa versa, the two assessors are calling on livestock men of the two counties together in order to ascertain whether the livestock should be assessed by Klamath or Modoc.

rived about the time that apples from Czechoslovakia, Austria, and France poured in, and German apples still further helped to glut the market. The result was a loss to apple growers all around.

This concentration of shipments in the late autumn has meant also that in March and April Germany will have practically no apples. The European varieties wont keep so long, it seems, and no provision has been made for American apples to be shipped. Apparently nobody has ever made it his business to supply the American apple growers with authentic information, and the department of agriculture's foreign service proposes to remedy this defect.

FRUIT GROWERS WILL BE AIDED

BERLIN, March 11.—When the apple growers of northern New York or of the far northwest want to know when, where, and in how great quantities it is advisable to

ship their product to Germany, they will hereafter be able to obtain accurate advice from the department of agriculture at Washington, or from its Berlin office at 6a Pariser Platz.

They will thereby avoid the situation that obtained with reference to the 1924 crop. Relying upon the advice of European brokers, the apple growers shipped large quantities of apples to Germany in September and October. These shipments ar-

FRESNO, Calif., March 11.—New Zealand eats more raisins per capita than any other country, according to a statement issued by a raisin growers' organization here. Residents of New Zealand aver-

age 4.40 pounds of raisins and 1.20 pounds of currants every year. England eats 1.85 pounds of raisins and 2.77 pounds of currants to each person annually. England's large consumption of currants is attributed to their wide use in sweet breads, cakes and puddings.
