BIG FIGHT CARD WILL BE STAGED IN THREE WEEKS

Abie Gordon Here to Make Arrangements for Battles in This City

Abie Gordon, one of the greatest little fighters ever developed in the west, is in Klamath Falls seeking to arrange a boxing card in which would be included some of the brightest stars of the squared ring in the northwest.

With two companions, the bantam-weight flash arrived in Klamath Falls last night with the news that he was ready to stage a boxing card in which he would fight his ancient rival, Frankie Grandetta. Earl Ritchie of Klamath Falls would take on Nig Yeager, knockout specialist of Portland; Sammy Gordon would fight Mike DeRinto; and two other outside welterweights would be brought in to complete the card.

Gordon is anxious to get things under way and to stage the fights about three weeks hence. He is in excellent condition and anxious to get a crack at Grandetta.

Would Meet Grandetta "Grandetta was given an unpopular decision against me in Los Angeles after I had floored him twice," he said. "The judges called it a draw and the referee awarded the decision to Grandetta. What I want to do is take him on again. I can stop him in ten rounds."

Grandetta and Gordon have fought many times. The fights were the most popular in Pacific coast prize rings. The bantamweights are undoubtedly at the top of their class in the Pacific coast and are headliners in all the cards of the larger coast cities.

TRIO ARE AFTER DEMPSEY FOR BATTLE

NEW YORK, March 13.—Jack Dempsey, heavyweight boxing champion, is a many fisted man if he can accomplish what one California and three New York promoters claim for him.

If he comes east, as he is expected to do, if the financial inducement is sufficient, Tex Rickard is expected to drag him toward the Yankee stadium. Jimmy DeForest will point him toward the Polo grounds and Charley Henderson will head him for the New Crater in Long Island city. This, of course, depends upon Dempsey's ability to elude California promoters. A triangular battle was apparent yesterday when DeForest telegraphed an offer of "more money than ever before" to Jack Kearns, the champion's manager, while Henderson determined to have a certified check for \$500,000 for Dempsey's services in a bout with Harry Wills and Tex Rickard foresook his trail in Trenton, N. J., long enough to explain that he had accomplished what he had set out to do in the past and could and would repeat.

DeForest trained Dempsey for the fight with Willard at Toledo, which gave Jack the championship and his desires may have some weight.
