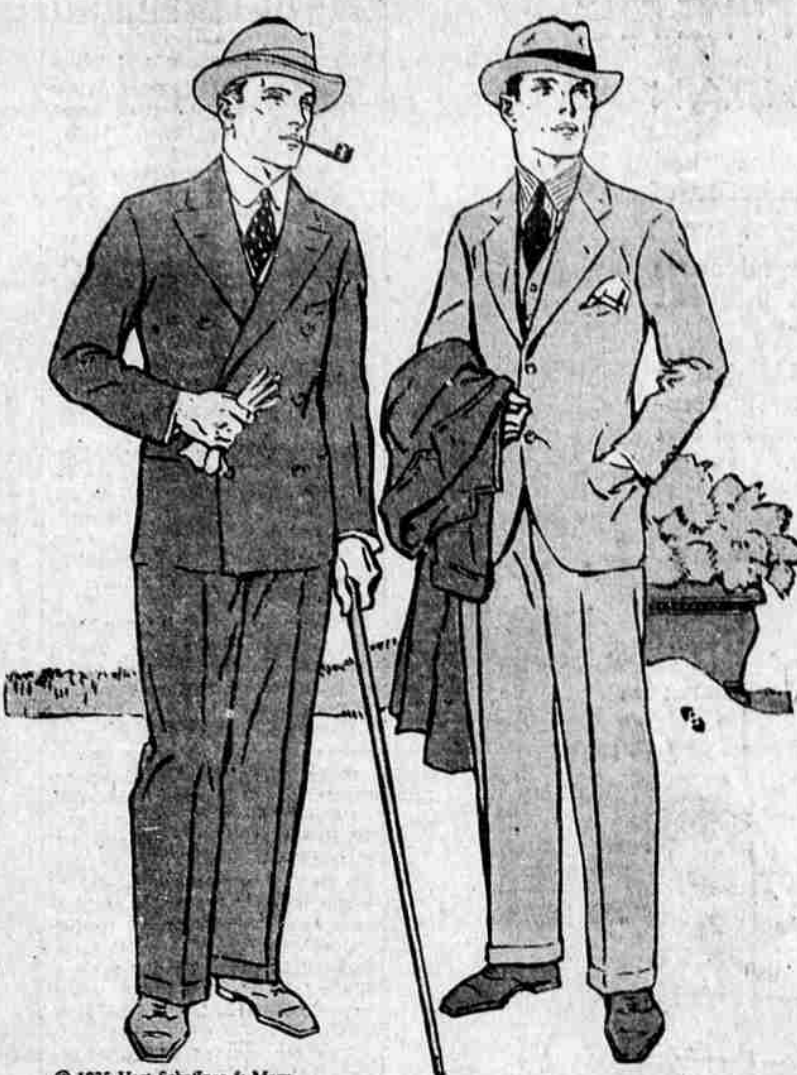

SCHOOLS URGED TO PREPARE FOR TRACK MEET THIS SEASON

CONVICTS ESCAPE  
DREW, Miss., March 17.—Somewhere in a swampy woods, six miles east of here a posse with bloodhounds today attempted to find the trail of 10 convicts who lined up the guards at the Mississippi state prison at Parchman, took their guns from them and locked them up and escaped in two automobiles.

"KID" M'COY IS CONVICTED OF ASSAULT

LOS ANGELES, March 17.—Kid McCoy, former pugilist recently sentenced to San Quentin for the slaying of Mrs. Theresa Mora here last August, today faced the prospect of having 38 years of imprisonment added to his term for manslaughter.

He was convicted in superior court yesterday on three counts of assault growing out of the pistol orgy which raged in Mrs. Mora's antique shop the morning after she died of a bullet wound in the apartment she and McCoy had been occupying.

One count of assault with a deadly weapon, carrying a penalty from 6 to 30 years imprisonment, concerned the wounding of W. J. Ross, who attempted to escape from the antique shop after McCoy had staggered in, drunk and disheveled, looking for Albert A. Mora, Mrs. Mora's divorced husband. The other two counts, charging assault with intent to murder and calling for penalties of from one to 14 years each, covered the wounding of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Schapp in the same affair.

McCoy will be sentenced Friday, at which time, if Judge Crail sees fit to assess the penalties consecutively the former globe-trotting prize fighter will be burdened with a possible additional term of 38 years.

The jury, which deliberated 75 hours before returning a verdict, acquitted McCoy on four other counts charging robbery.

WASHINGTON, March 17.—In accordance with the resolution at last session of congress the I. C. C. today ordered an investigation into the existing freight rate structure of all the railroads in the country.

JAP ENVOY DENIES IMMIGRATION WILL BE TAKEN UP AGAIN

WASHINGTON, March 17.—Reports that Tsuneo Matsudaira, the new Japanese ambassador to Washington, had received instructions before leaving Tokyo to reopen the immigration question upon his arrival here was denied today by the envoy.

His instructions, the ambassador said, were purely of a general character designed to promote friendship between the two governments. He added, however, that although the immigration question was regarded in the United States as settled forever, hope still was entertained and another resolution found acceptable to both Tokyo and Washington.
