MINES MENACE BALTIC SHIPS

20,000 Mines Laid During War Rising to Surface in Foreign Waters

AMSTERDAM, March 17.—Twenty thousand deep sea mines are slowly rising to the surface in the Baltic and adjacent waters and are becoming a formidable menace to shipping, according to A. Flaes, Netherlands consul-general in Hamburg.

In a report published here recently Mr. Flaes says that during the war 60,000 mines were laid between Bergen, Norway, and the Baltic archipelago. Forty thousand of them have been recovered in some way or other; mostly, it is assumed, through the chains by which they were secured being gradually eaten away by the action of the sea water.

The rest are still unaccounted for, and they are reappearing gradually in unexpected places. The consul gives warning that the Baltic, the Bothnian Gulf and the Finnish waters will not be entirely mine-free for a long time to come.

ROAD WIDENING JOB TO START THIS WEEK

Cutting, filling, grading and other work necessary to widen the Dalles-California highway between Klamath Falls and Barclay Springs will be started this week, according to announcement from the state highway department today. A force of 13 men will be started on the job at the start and more will be employed as necessity requires. The work will be handled solely by the maintenance forces of the state highway department. The work was deemed necessary to insure safe movement of traffic during the heavy travel of tourist months.

CHURCH MAY BE USED School Board Reacts Favorably To Request Of Rev. Meryweather

Request was made last night at the city school board meeting by the Rev. T. A. Meryweather to allow the Episcopal congregation to use the church on Seventh and H'gh streets till Easter Sunday, April 12. While not making any definite promises, the board indicated that they would be willing to allow the extension of time, unless unforeseen obstacles intervene. The church was to have been vacated by April 1, in order that steps could be taken to remove the building before construction starts on the new Central school.


