ENGLAND WILL AID AUSTRALIA

Mother Country to Assist Island in Caring for Immigrants

MELBOURNE, March 17.—The British government will advance Australia approximately \$5,000,000 for every 14,000 immigrants sent to Australia from England, according to an agreement recently concluded between the British treasury officials and Australia. The money will be used for public improvements such as waterworks, roads, railways, land clearing and housing in sections where immigrants settle, and in otherwise providing opportunities equal to those of native Australians.

Great Britain has agreed also to contribute to the cost of receiving depots to be established in the various states. Australia expects to borrow a total of \$170,000,000 for migration purposes. The imperial government's agreement provides for the payment of \$25,000,000 for interest charges, the money to be used for public improvements. The flotation of the loan itself will be undertaken by Australia, and the borrowings will probably extend over a long period.

The New South Wales government has recently accepted the commonwealth government's offer of \$2,500,000 for fostering immigration. This money will be advanced in London as required.

IMPROVE HEALTH IN PHILIPPINES

Assurance of Financial Support Given to Island Health Service

MANILA, March 17.—With the assurance of financial support of its work here for another year, as shown by a liberal provision in the appropriation bill for 1925, the Rockefeller Foundation will inaugurate a new program for public health improvement in the Philippine Islands next year consisting of the establishment of provincial sanitary demonstrations.

At its own expense the foundation will undertake the operation of a provincial sanitary service primarily to demonstrate improved facilities employed in rural sanitary work, and also to train Filipino assistants who may take over the work after it has been organized.

For more than two years the foundation has conducted an anti-malaria campaign in several provinces in cooperation with the Philippine health service.

The foundation also started a successful anti-hookworm campaign several months ago, and this has now been given over to the Philippine health service.
