SALEM, Ore., March 24.—A list of appointments devolving upon President Moser of the state senate and speaker Burdick of the lower house has been filed with the Secretary of State.

On a committee provided by senate joint resolution 17 to investigation methods of assessment and taxation, President Moser has appointed Senator Henry L. Corbett and A. A. Smith of Baker, and Speaker Burdick has appointed Representative John Carlin, of Medford and Carl D. Shoemaker of Portland.

A special committee to study reforestation, authorized under house joint resolution 20, Senator Moser has appointed Senator Dennis of La Grande and Russell Hawkins of Garibaldi, and Speaker Burdick has appointed Ray H. Chapler of the west forestry conservation association, Representative Bates of Clatsop county and J. H. Driscoll of Klamath Falls.
