FAIR PREMIUMS TO TOTAL \$4500

Amount Available Twice That of Last Year, Says Board

A general meeting of the Fair Board was held recently at which was definitely decided some of the new rulings for general classification and livestock entries at the County Fair. It was learned that \$4,500, is available for premiums this year, almost double the amount last season. All group and herd livestock classes will be awarded three prizes, \$15, \$10 and \$5. This is materially higher than those of other fairs throughout the Willamette Valley. Several new classes in the livestock division have been added, notably those for cow with calf at hoof, several herd divisions, baby beef and fat cattle. The national breeders' association is being approached early in the season this year for support in the award of special breed offers.

It was decided to install a separator and proper facilities for handling milk and milk utensils for dairymen exhibiting during the fair. This will be a distinct saving to the dairy men who heretofore had to let their milk cool before separating, thereby suffering much loss on the production of exhibit animals.

A tailored bow is apt to lend a graceful touch to this type of pump, and the heel, which makes for comfort, is a Cuban.

Frequently in the combined leather pump, a strap or two also make for smartness in place of the more colonial bow or buckle.

For afternoon the smartest materials are kidskin in beige or brown, patent leather or a combination of patent leather and kidskin. Comfort, of course, is always to be found in the newer shoes when selected with discrimination. The model which receives the support of ankle straps is particularly well chosen with an eye to easy walking. Variations of the one or two strap models are the most correct in design.

For evening the sandal slipper leads in chic. These sandals are cut practically to the sole and reveal startling glimpses of the silken clad foot, while one strap runs smartly over the instep and is attached to a narrow strap over the ankle.

Materials in moire, gold and silver kid, or combinations of these, are distinctly smart, as are white and silver brocade materials. In some very chic models embroidery in the popular peasant patterns lends distinction to the really new even slipper. Blond satin, which is such a perfect accompaniment to the delicate evening gown, is still at the height of fashion's favor.
