In the matter of establishment of Toll Road on Klamath Falls, Bend County Road.

It appearing to the Court at this time that the old county road from the intersection with the State Highway at the gap on Fort Klamath Hill in Klamath County to the county line north of Crescent, Oregon, is little used for local travel; and that there are very few residents on said described road; that it is so located that there is little or no local labor along the line of said road, and that for the county to maintain said road in a passable condition would entail a very heavy expense, far out of proportion to the benefits to be derived; and that each year during the period of from about the first day of December to about the first of June said road is blocked by heavy snows and is ordinarily abandoned during the greater portion of said time by the traveling public owing to the difficulty of passing through the heavy snows in the winter time; and that the County is at the present time, with the State, constructing a new highway between the points mentioned, and the county does not desire to divert money from said highway construction for the purpose of maintaining a road that will shortly be abandoned almost wholly by the public; and that there is now little or no local labor along said old county road; and it appearing expedient and lawful that a toll road should be established on said old county road, and the Court being now fully advised in the premises.

It is, therefore, ordered that said road, between the termini above mentioned be leased to any person or corporation to open, improve and keep same in repair for the period of five years between December first and June first inclusive only, with the right in consideration there to collect and receive tolls for travel thereon as provided by Chapter XXXIX, Title XXX, Oregon Laws; that four gates shall be placed on said road; that the grade of said road shall remain as now established; that the materials for construction of said road shall be as now used therein; and it is further ordered that the County Clerk cause this order to be published in a weekly newspaper of general circulation in Klamath County for four successive weeks and in like manner give notice that sealed bids will be received at such Clerk's office for the leasing of such road until the hour of 2:00 o'clock p. m. on the 28 day of February 1925; all bids must comply with and be subject to the provisions of the law above mentioned.

NEED, NOT LOSS, OF VICTIMS TO BE RELIEF AIM

WEST FRANKFORT, Ill., March 25.—The work of the American Red Cross in rehabilitation in the entire tornado district area in five states will begin at once, according to Henry M. Baker, National director of disaster relief here. It will include replacing and re-furnishing homes, clothing and what necessities of victims, but will not attempt to replace deficits in investment losses which he called business rehabilitation.

Director, Baker will be in personal charge of the entire five state district. Each county will constitute a separate district with an executive office.

The need of the victim and not his loss will guide attempts to re-establish him in an nearly a pre-disaster basis as funds will permit, said Baker. A careful survey will be made by trained workers to ascertain the needs of the storm sufferers and the Red Cross then will attempt to make up the deficit so far as funds are available.
