Sugar Agriculturist Arrives In Klamath From California

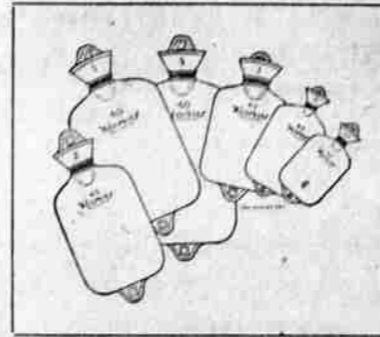
