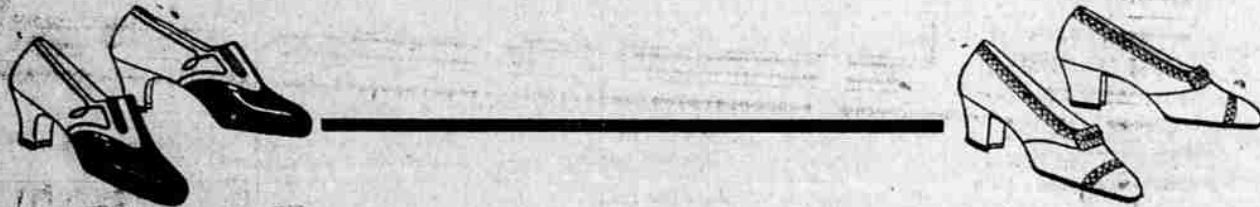

COUNCIL HASTENS STREET PROJECTS

Three resolutions, setting the machinery in motion for the paving of 29 blocks in Klamath Falls, were passed last night by the city council, in special session at the city hall.

Passing of the three resolutions indicates that Klamath Falls will experience the biggest street improvement year ever recorded in the history of the city. The job of the 29 blocks will represent an investment of \$153,057.04.

The improvement is divided into three improvement areas: (1), Fourth from Klamath avenue to Walnut street; Fifth from Klamath avenue to Oak street; Seventh from Klamath avenue to Oak; Eighth from Walnut to Oak street; Ninth from Klamath avenue to Oak; Eleventh from Klamath to Walnut; Oak from Fourth to Ninth.

The second area is North on Fifth street from Pine to Jefferson. The third area is north on Second street from Pine to Jefferson.
