WHITE ROADS GIVE DRIVERS VARIETY OF EYE AILMENTS

LONDON, March 31.—The gray or white surfaced roads of England, at which the increasing number of automobile drivers are compelled to gaze intently in guiding their speeding cars, are causing a mass of minor eye troubles, according to Arthur Upson in a recent address before the Institute of Opticians.

White roads reflect the harmful actinic rays, and Mr. Upson recommends that road builders mix green coloring matter with their surfacing material.
