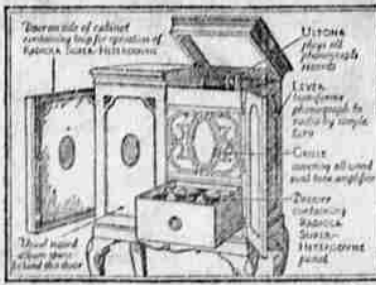
FORT KLAMATH

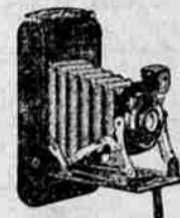

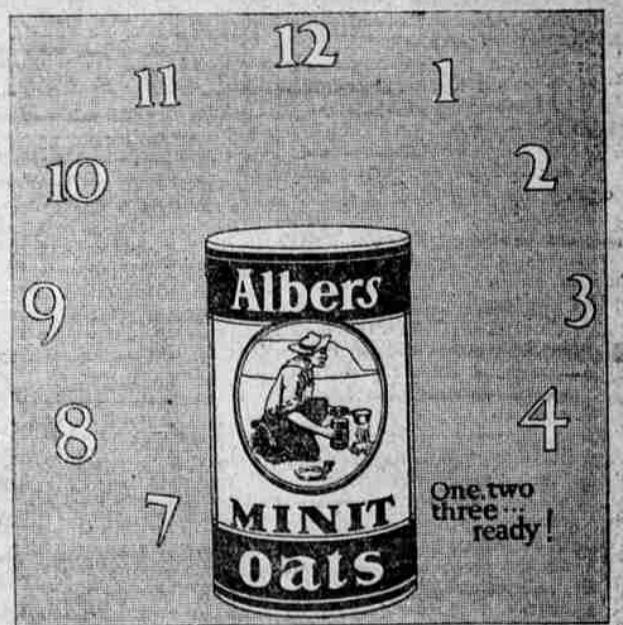
threw Menjou from the saddle and galloped off down the road. Menjou was not hurt and members of "The Swan" company began calling him "Prince" with a new intonation.
