VEATCH FILES HIS ANSWER IN WRANGLE OVER FISH BOARD

PORTLAND, Ore., April 3.—John C. Veatch, recently appointed state fish commissioner by Governor Pierce today filed answer to the question of action brought about a week ago by Dr. Thomas W. Ross, deposed commissioner, asking that Veatch appear in court and show cause and by what authority he holds office as commissioner.

Veatch in his answer denies that Ross' removal was illegal. He states that December 16, 1924, Governor Pierce brought charges against Ross on which a hearing was held December 22. Ross was subsequently removed from the commission and Veatch was appointed January 10, the answer states.

SALEM, Ore., April 3.—Governor Pierce yesterday appointed the state recreation commission, and having as its purpose the giving of advice and assistance in recreational projects and physical education. It is a volunteer organization and no pay is received by the members.

The members are: John C. Henderson, Portland, director of community service; W. A. Kearns, athletic director at Oregon agricultural college; John F. Howard, University

of Oregon; O. A. Kratz, city manager at Astoria; Fred Kiddle, Island City, past state commander of American Legion, Miss Carin Degermark, Portland, and Marshall N. Daza, Portland.
