OUT OF THE AIR

A popular type of circuit with which some fans have had exceptional success and others a dismal failure is the reflex. The principle of operation is identical with any other set, the difference lies in the fact that a tube is used for both radio and audio amplifier at the same time. By doing this much greater amplification is obtained per tube than in other sets. The chief difficulty generally with these sets is mostly mechanical. That is, the finding of proper instruments to handle this type of energy. Many fans make a reflex set out of materials that are designed for ordinary outfits and therefore failure is the result of the set when hooked up. An example may be cited in the audio frequency transformer. It can be seen that an instrument designed for this purpose of handling the output of one or two tubes would not efficiently handle the output of five and that is just what the last audio frequency transformer in a three tube reflex set does. This applies also to audio frequency transformers. As the energy increases the winding of the transformers should vary. Manufacturers of reflex transformers build and design them for different stages.

The crystal detector is a much neglected part of the reflex set. It has only been in recent months that

suitable minerals to handle the great output of the multi tube reflex set have been offered to the public. There is no doubt that a reflex set does put a great strain on the crystal as it rectifies the output of all three tubes at radio frequency which undoubtedly is greater than accumulated on the antenna and is used in the average crystal set. The secret in a reflex set, therefore is, use good parts to build with, especially designed and constructed for reflex receivers, get a good crystal and follow all specifications given to the last detail.

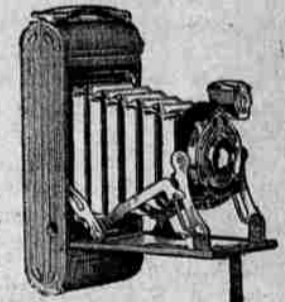
