Order providing for the issuance advertisement and sale of road bonds.

In the matter of the issuance of \$125,000 of Road Bonds by Klamath County.

Whereas, at a road bond election duly called and held in Klamath County, Oregon, on the 4th day of November, 1924, an issue of bonds for the construction and maintenance of permanent roads in said county was duly authorized by the voters of said county in the sum of \$125,000, together with interest thereon, said bonds to mature and come due as follows, to-wit:

- \$3000 eleven years from date of issue;
\$3000 twelve years from date of issue;
\$3000 thirteen years from date of issue;
\$3000 fourteen years from date of issue;
\$3000 fifteen years from date of issue;
\$5000 sixteen years from date of issue;
\$5000 seventeen years from date of issue;
\$5000 eighteen years from date of issue;
\$5000 nineteen years from date of issue;
\$5000 twenty years from date of issue;
\$7000 twenty one years from date of issue;
\$7000 twenty two years from date of issue;
\$7000 twenty three years from date of issue;
\$7000 twenty four years from date of issue;
\$7000 twenty five years from date of issue;
\$10000 twenty six years from date of issue;
\$10000 twenty seven years from date of issue;

the County Judge and the County Clerk of said County, the entire issue aforesaid to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on April 1 and October 1 of each year, said interest being represented by interest coupons attached to said bonds bearing the engraved fac-simile signature of the said County Judge and County Clerk, both principal and interest payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, and it is further

Ordered, that the bonds hereby authorized, and the coupons attached thereto, shall be in substantially the following form:

No. \$1000.00 United States of America, State of Oregon, Bond of Klamath County, issued for the construction of permanent roads therein, Series C.

The County of Klamath, in the State of Oregon, for value received promise to pay to bearer One thousand Dollars on the 1st day of April 19... with interest thereon at the rate of ... per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of April and October to the bearer of the respective coupons therefor hereto attached upon presentation and surrender thereof as they mature, both principal and interest being payable in United States Gold coin of the present standard value at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City.

This bond is one of a series of like date and tenor, except as to maturity, numbered 1 to 125 inclusive, authorized by a vote of the voters of Klamath County, Oregon, voting at an election held for said purpose in said County on the 4th day of November, 1924, held in pursuance of law, and under said by virtue of an order of the County Court of said County, after due notice given, at which said election an indebtedness of the sum of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand dollars (\$125,000) and interest thereon was authorized for the construction of permanent roads in said County.

And it is hereby certified that every requirement of law relating to the issue thereof has been duly complied with and that this bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the constitution or laws of the State of Oregon, and that for the punctual payment of the principal and interest hereon the full faith and credit of Klamath County is hereby irrevocably pledged.

In witness whereof, the County of Klamath has caused its seal to be hereto affixed and this bond to be signed by the County Judge and the County Clerk of said County, and the annexed coupons to bear the fac-simile signatures of the said officers this 1st day of April 1925.

The undersigned as County Treasurer for Klamath County, Oregon, hereby certifies that the within bond, with its attached coupons, is one of a series of bonds authorized by a vote of the voters of Klamath County, Oregon, at an election held throughout said County for said purpose on the 4th day of November, 1924, which vote authorized the creation of an indebtedness in the sum of \$125,000 and interest thereon, and authorized the issuance of such bonds.

Dated at Klamath Falls, Klamath County, Oregon, this 1st day of April 1925. (signed) County Treasurer of Klamath County, Oregon, and it is further Ordered, that beginning with the fourth year after the sale of the aforesaid issue of bonds, the County Court shall each year thereafter set aside as a special fund for the payment of the bonds such percentage of the face value of such bonds, as the date of maturity shall agree-

with the full face value thereof; and it is further

Ordered that the amount necessary to provide said redemption fund, and to pay the annual interest on outstanding bonds, shall be added to the general levy of taxes as may be required from year to year, which taxes shall be levied upon all the taxable property within Klamath County; and it is further

Ordered, that the 14th day of March 1925, at the Chamber of the County Court in the County Court House, in Klamath Falls, Klamath County, Oregon, at 4 o'clock p. m. are hereby fixed as the time and place for the sale of the aforesaid bonds in the sum of One Hundred Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) as hereinabove indicated; and the County Clerk of said Klamath County is hereby instructed to make due advertisement thereof by publishing notice of sale of such bonds for at least three weeks, in the Evening Herald and in the Klamath News two newspapers printed in Klamath County, Oregon.
