German Made Two-Speed Car Popular

A well known German car, a high grade six, is made with a two-speed and reverse planetary transmission somewhat similar to the Ford, high-

gear being used on all but the steepest grades, when low gear is obtained by pressing a pedal. The clutch is not used when starting, since the car has a starter and a battery large enough to start the car from rest. Starting therefore consists in manipulating starting pedal and accelerator, which are close together, while the clutch is engaged. Whenever the car is stopped the engine is stopped. Other very high-grade cars have been built recently with just two speeds forward. There is no reason why a planetary transmission should not be quiet when carefully made.

Cubs vs. Pirates CHICAGO, April 14.—Fair weather today brought predictions of an attendance of 32,000 fans at the season's opener between the Chicago Cubs and Pittsburgh Pirates, with the veteran Grover Cleveland Alexander, right hander, opposing Emil Yde, left handed youth. The raising of a flag commemorating the fiftieth anniversary of the National league was the only ceremony on the program.

Giants Prepared NEW YORK, April 14.—Greater New York's major league baseball teams, opening the 1925 season at home today, called upon their pitchers to bring them victories. Manager Miller Huggins announced his intention to pitch Urban Shocker, the former St. Louis moundsman, against the world champion Washington club, while Brooklyn's choice for the slab in the Dodger's opener against the Philadelphia Nationals was Dazzy Vance.

There was a chance of Walter Johnson getting the twirling assignment for the Senators. Manager Harris announced.

Manager Fletcher favored Jimmy Ring to pitch for the Phillies. The Yanks planned to welcome 50,000 fans with music by three bands and arrangements were made for the first ball to be thrown by Rear Admiral Charles H. Plunkett, commander of the Brooklyn navy yards.

Record Attendance CINCINNATI, April 14.—Cincinnati was prepared to surpass all former record crowds in ushering in the new baseball season at Redland field, where the St. Louis Cardinals and Reds clash in the first championship round this afternoon.

Allen Eatherton and Pete Donohue were the choices of their respective managers to do the hurling.

Big Detroit Crowd DETROIT, April 14.—A capacity crowd of perhaps 35,000 was in view for the opening game of the American league season today with Detroit meeting Chicago. All reserved seats were sold several days in advance and bleacher fans stood in line from early morning. Warren Collins was Manager Cobbs' pitching choice, with Johnny Bassler catching. Eddie Collins announced Faber and Crouse as likely his selections.

Use Star Battery PHILADELPHIA, April 14.—Connie Mack planned to send the Athletics' new \$150,000 battery, Groves and Cochrane, against the Boston Red Sox in the opening game here of the American league baseball season. James Poole, another new comer, is on first base for the Athletics in place of Joe Hauser, who is out with a broken knee cap. Manager Pohl said he probably would use Ferguson on the mound.

Joe Bush Pitches ST. LOUIS, April 14.—For the opening of the American league season here today, Manager George Slaughter lined up a team to oppose the Cleveland Indians similar to the one he used during the spring series, with "Bullet" Joe Bush slated to pitch. It is probable that he will work against Sherrod Smith.

Record Sale of Dodge Brothers Cars Noted
