DON ZUMWALT IS BACK

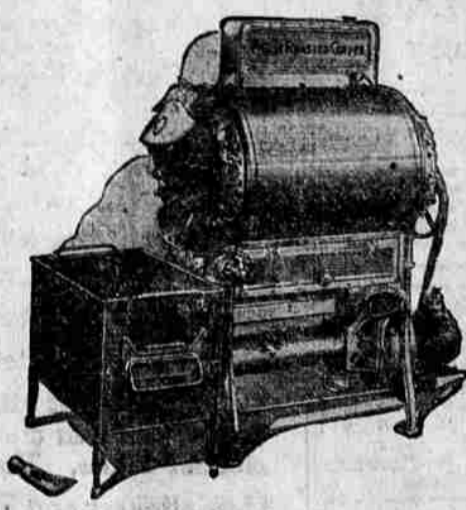
Former City Engineer Returns After Long Vacation
