BANISHED BARONS TO RESTORE CZAR: CYRIL

WARSAW, April 16.—Russian royalists who cannot refrain from intriguing to get a czar back on the throne of all the Russians, are having a rough time in central Europe these days. Poland does not care to be the center for movements of this kind, and whenever the evidence is sufficient the police call around and take a group of agitators to jail.
A recent raid in Warsaw on supporters of the claims of Grand Duke Cyril brought into the net Count Tull Baron Tiefenhausen, Prince Aveloff and a number of other titled Russian, chiefly former army officers. The specific charge was spying upon the Polish army. Documents captured with the prisoners are said to reveal all sorts of plots for the re-establishment of the Russian empire.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that the General Laws of the State of Oregon, Volume 11, Section 3359, provide as follows: "§350. Duty to destroy ground squirrels and noxious rodents. It shall be, and is hereby, declared to be the duty of every person, firm, copartnership, company and corporation owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, place, building, structure, wharf, pier, or dock which is infested with ground squirrels and other noxious rodents or predatory animals, or as soon as the presence of the same shall come to his, their or its knowledge, at once proceed and continue in good faith to exterminate and destroy such rodents by poisoning, trapping or other appropriate and effective means. (L. 1919, c. 127-13.)
WITNESSETH: That I, J. C. Cleghorn, do hereby certify that the following are the names of the persons who have been declared to be the duty of every person, firm, copartnership, company and corporation owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, place, building, structure, wharf, pier, or dock which is infested with ground squirrels and other noxious rodents or predatory animals, or as soon as the presence of the same shall come to his, their or its knowledge, at once proceed and continue in good faith to exterminate and destroy such rodents by poisoning, trapping or other appropriate and effective means: (L. 1919, c. 127-13.)
