SQUIRREL POISONING Notice to Property Owners

County of Klamath, State of Oregon, as KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that the General Laws of the State of Oregon, Volume 11, Section 9250, provide as follows: "9250: Duty to destroy ground squirrels and noxious rodents. It shall be, and is hereby, declared to be the duty of every person, firm, copartnership, company and corporation owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, place, building, structure, wharf, pier, or dock which is infested with ground squirrels and other noxious rodents or predatory animals, or as soon as the presence of the same shall come to his, their or its knowledge, at once proceed and continue in good faith to exterminate and destroy such rodents by poisoning, trapping or other appropriate and effective means. (L. 1919, c. 127-1).

WITNESSETH: That poisoners only prepared under the U. S. formula, for the extermination of ground squirrels may be procured from the office of the County Agent, Room "D" Courthouse, Klamath Falls; from Merrill Mercantile Company, Merrill; Mack's Cash Store, Mt. Laki; Kallina's Store, Malin; Sparretora's Store, Bonanza; Bly Mercantile Store, Bly; and Prather's Cash Store, Keno.

That the method of distributing such poison should be as follows, to-wit: Place teaspoonful of poisoned oats at or near the mouth of the burrow on warm, sunny days, preferably in the morning. Cover the entire field or fields in this manner.
