## VESSELS CRASH NEAR ASTORIA

Jap Ship Yoshida Maru and Steamer Charles R. McCormick Collide

ASTORIA, Ore., April 17.—The Japanese steamer Yoshida Maru No. 1 and the steamer Charles R. McCormick collided head-on early this morning in the Columbia river off the Port Adams life saving station. Both vessels were damaged.

One fireman on the Japanese vessel was injured. The Charles R. McCormick, which proceeded on upstream to the Astoria anchorage, was reported as taking water in a forward hold.

The Yoshida Maru No. 1 absorbed the shock in the destruction of its forepeak tank and was not taking water in any of its freight holds.

## INDIAN FREED AS MURDERER

live appearing Indian, told how he and Harry Jerry came to the Harry home on the fatal day and how the three had drunk heavily from the contents of the barrel until all were intoxicated and Harry started to fight. Mrs. Harry and the two children finally fled, Mrs. Harry taking the children away in fear that they might be crushed in the struggle. Pepper said that Harry pulled his knife, bottles started flying and one filled with turpentine struck him between the eyes and broke, blinding him for the time. He declared that Harry in his efforts to strike some one with the knife ripped his own clothing.

Lingered Two Days

Following the brawl, Harry lived two days before he died from the deeply inflicted wounds, according to witnesses. The weather had made the roads fairly impassable and before medical aid could reach Harry he died.

Pepper gave a recitation of how the afternoon had started in all gaily, Harry with a guitar and he with a drum. They played their quaint airs as they drank, each getting deeper and deeper in his cups until all were maudlin.

The state called Benson Harry, brother of the dead man; Felix J. Kunz, Dr. Charles Pius, Mrs. F. B. Kennedy, Mrs. Margaret Harry, mother of Harry, and Mrs. Hazel Harry, the widow. The defense summoned Harry Jerry, Susie and Dunphy Pepper, the defendant's mother and father; Fred and Lucile Johnson, his cousins; Nellie Johnson, his aunt; George Tripp, constable for the district; Judge Hickox and his son, William.

The Jurors

The jury includes Robert W. Wright, Henry Farrington, Joseph Davidson, Martin L. Frame, Kenneth C. Traux, Homer Culloway, M. S. Meow, Harry M. Bryan, Charles E. Harros, James D. Herbert, J. Nevill and Edwin Baker.

Both sides finished submitting testimony last night and the arguments should be concluded by noon today.

During the trial, the streets of Yreka recalled the old days with the groups of Indians wandering here and there. Fearful that liquor might be secured by some of the tribesmen, county and city officials have been vigilant and just before the close of the session yesterday afternoon, Constable M. C. Carrick arrested three for disorderly conduct and had them held. It is said that they had rounded canned heat and were making merry with it. 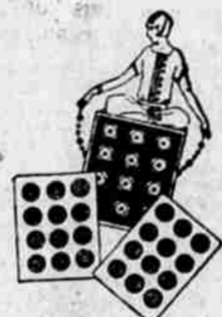

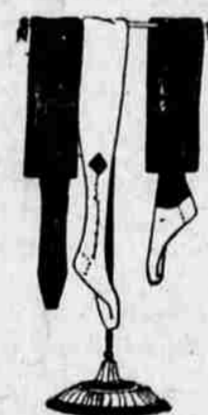

## Three Children At Round Lake Compose School

Personal attention from the instructor—the ideal education—is accorded at least three pupils of Klamath county.

For these three pupils and their teacher, Miss Vera Jungjohann, compose what is officially known as the Round Lake school house.

When school opened last fall, it was found that there were nine pupils of the vicinity who were ready to attend school. But as month succeeded month, by ones and twos, pupils dropped out until at this time there are but three pupils left.

Inasmuch its transportation of pupils to another school would be difficult and the teacher being hired

for a full school year, it was decided to keep the school "as is." So the school carries on and the three pupils are taking advantage of the close contact with their instructor by absorbing everything with the stamp of knowledge that is handed out to them.

## LAKE COUNTY ROAD WORK IS UNDER WAY

LAKEVIEW, Apr. 17.—Construction on the Lakeview-Alturas road has started this week with a grading crew at work on a two mile section just south of Lakeview. The grading work will be completed in two weeks, and the county road crew will then be placed on the job of grading 12 miles of the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway from Lakeview west to the eastern terminus of the Drews Valley section. The heavier work in road construction and grading will be handled under contract, county authorities said.

## FIVE BURN TO DEATH IN FIRE

### Blaze at Marshfield Early Today Wipes Out an Entire Family

MARSHFIELD, Ore., April 17.—Five members of one family were burned to death in a fire which destroyed a frame building here this morning. The dead: H. H. Hopps, 72; Mrs. H. H. Hopps, 65; Vernon Hopps, 17; Ruth Hopps, 13; Herman Hopps, 10. The bodies were burned beyond recognition. The victims were apparently suffocated in the fire.

Hopps came here two years ago from Florence, Oregon, where another daughter, Mrs. H. M. Peterson, resides. The family came originally from New York City.
