Pictures in The Home

Styles in pictures change as the years go by, much the same as they do in furniture and clothes. To be sure, the really good, the original masterpieces of the past are always in style, but really very few of us can afford such luxuries. The day of the life size portrait has passed, and we no longer share with the casual sojourner in the home the intimacy of portraits of any kind. Photographs belong in the privacy of one's own personal room. Religious pictures, too, are too personal for the general living room, unless the picture is a rare and choice piece of workmanship, unusual and interesting enough to be a joy to every art lover.

Did you ever try to settle with yourself just what excuse you have for the presence on the walls of your home, of each and every picture? If not try it some day and you will be surprised to find that you are giving space and time to pictures which, like some people, actually give you nothing in the way of enjoyment or, worse still, radiate gloom and unhappiness. Pictures should be chosen like friends, carefully and thoughtfully for their real value to us personally.

When selecting pictures for a room which is to be used by those outside the family circle, one should select those which through technique or pure joyousness will interest and give pleasure to others, as well as to the immediate family. There are so many good prints, colored photographs and etchings to be had today at a very reasonable figure and it should be easy to find just the right picture for each wall space, not too many, but just enough.

Pictures of a purely personal character belong in one's private room and should be changed as one's interests change. For instance, the boy of the family may be interested in radio today, football tomorrow, and something else next week so why not allow him to surround himself while in his room with pictures which will help him to enjoy to the fullest his latest hobby? A piece of cretonne or a piece of monk's cloth fastened to the wall will save the woodwork and plaster, by providing a convenient place where clippings and unframed pictures may be pinned.

Picture framing has become an art and one should consult some one who has studied the subject before deciding on the frame, for the frame may absolutely ruin an otherwise interesting picture, just as a poor style of hair dressing ruins a face. Never hang a picture with a single wire which comes to a point above the picture, for the eye invariably follows along two lines which meet. Hang all pictures with a concealed wire or by two vertical wires. All pictures should be hung low enough so that the eye of the average person when standing looks straight ahead and catches the point of interest in the picture.

PARIS, April 22.—Former Premier Edouard Herriot, was elected president of the chamber of deputies this evening. He received 270 votes with but a single vote against him, the opposition abstaining from voting.

FIRE CHIEF HURT

SAN FRANCISCO, April 22.—Battalion chief John F. Kearney was severely injured and six other firemen slightly hurt in an early morning fire here today. Two lodging houses and an automobile supply store were burned with a loss of \$30,000 to \$40,000.

Policeman Ray O'Connell carried several women and children to safety. Others jumped into a life net from the second and third floors of the lodging house.

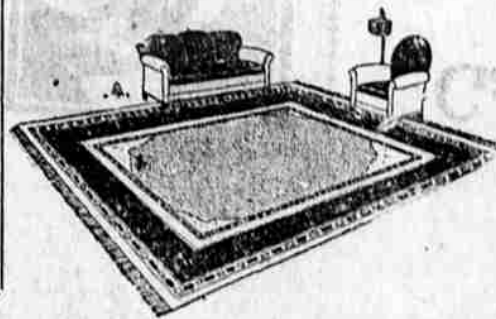

WASHINGTON, April 22.—The temporary injunction restraining sale to the Dollar interests of five shipping-board vessels in the Pacific trade has been extended until tomorrow.

Attorneys for the Pacific Mail Steamship company, which now operates the vessels for the board asked for the extension so that the Pacific Mail officials could have more time to decide their future action in the case.

D. A. R. MEETS

WASHINGTON, April 22.—Action on proposed amendments to its constitution and offering the nominations for seven vice presidents general were the most important matters before today's session of the annual congress of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Consideration of various committee reports also was on the program. A report presented by Mrs. Alfred J. Brosseau, chairman of the Ellis Island committee, contained a belated record of the society's work during the past year among arriving immigrants there and also at the Angel Island, California, station.

PRISONER ESCAPES

ROSEBURG, Ore., April 22.—Lee Duncan, alias R. G. Harper, who escaped from the county jail yesterday after slugging Deputy Sheriff Sewell, stole an overcoat and food at the Fred Fisher Roberts creek ranch, according to word received this morning by Sheriff Starmer. Mrs. A. P. Johnson, who resides at the ranch, telephoned in this morning that an army overcoat had been stolen off the porch where it was used for covering flowers, and that a half gallon of milk and several pounds of dried prunes had also been taken. Duncan escaped without hat or coat, so officers are sure that he was responsible for the theft of the overcoat. Duncan was last seen yesterday in the vicinity of Glangary, and the ranch where the thefts were reported is in a direct line south from that point.

GETS HEAVY JOIT

PENDLETON, Ore., April 22.—A new record on punishment in Umatilla county for violation of the liquor laws was established yesterday in the justice of peace in Hermiton, when Justice West fined Art Spinning and J. D. Fahlen \$1500 each and sentenced each of them to one year in the county jail.
