## HIGHER LIVING COST PREDICTED

Frank L. Lowden of Illinois Declares Farmers Must Have Help

NEW YORK, April 23.—A disastrous increase in the cost of living was predicted here by Frank O. Lowden, former governor of Illinois, unless aid is given the farmers in organizing for the cooperative marketing of their products. The former governor, speaking last night at the annual dinner of the bureau of advertising of the American newspaper publishers' association, said that American agriculture was decaying, that farm bankers had increased 600 per cent in recent years and that farms are being abandoned in increasing number all over the country.
