LOS ANGELES, April 23.—A coroner's jury late yesterday exonerated Bobby Allen of any part in the death of Harry Simone, boxer, who died here last Saturday night of concussion of the brain after he had fought Allen in a San Bernardino ring the previous Thursday.

**RUMOR DENIED**  
PARIS, April 23.—The Bulgarian legation issued an official denial of the report that King Boris had demanded the resignation of the cabinet headed by Premier Alexander Tashkoff. "An accord has never ceased to exist between the King and Premier," the communique declared.

**TOWN CAPTURED**  
MANAGUA, Nicaragua, April 23.—It is reported that La Ceiba, a minor port sixty miles west of Trujillo, had been captured by Honduran revolutionists. Despite this report it is claimed by a confidential agent of the Honduran government here that the revolutionists are using ground throughout the republic.

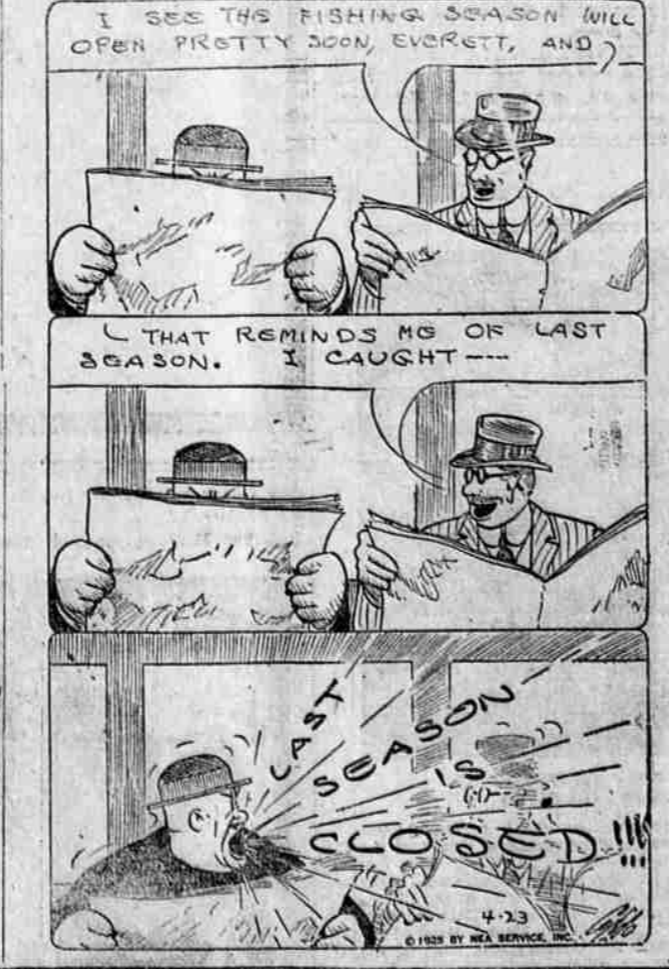
