One of the enjoyable features of the program was demonstration made by members of the Home Making club. Kathryn Pope demonstrated the efficient method of making a bed; Mildred Hayes demonstrated how one can save steps and accomplish more work in the kitchen; and Genevieve Goods demonstrated the approved method in removing stains from linen.

Mrs. W. J. Jinnette is the local club leader of the Merrill Home Making club and Miss Ellen McVeigh club leader of the Merrill home cookery club.

Merrill now stands in the lead in county club work, as to enrollment with four standard clubs: Potato, Home Making, Home Cookery and Sewing.

Women's Organization Is Formally Disbanded

WASHINGTON, April 24.—The national woman suffrage association has formally ended its life of nearly 75 years devoted to the fight to obtain the vote for women. Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, president, presided at a meeting of its officers and other suffrage leaders called here yesterday for the formal disbanding of the organization through which suffrage pioneers started before the civil war, the movement which achieved its goal with the adoption of the nineteenth amendment five years ago.

RESTRAIN LOGGERS FROM PICKET DUTY

WENATCHEE, Wash., April 24.—A restraining order issued by Judge W. O. Parr of superior court here was in force today whereby the men who recently quit work on the Great Northern Lumber company's log drive will be prohibited from picketing on or near the premises of the company or in any way interfering with men now employed on the log drive.

Action was taken after a suit against the 37 strikers, alleged members of the Industrial Workers of the World, was filed by the lumber company asking \$5000 damages from each of the industrials. A hearing will be held May 6. The court ordered strikers from congregating on the premises or interfering with any of the employees, hissing, hooting, jeering or yelling "scab."

NEW YORK, April 24.—Excavations of ancient towers for sun worship in Mesopotamia may furnish architects with new ideas for skyscrapers, according to Professor Beresford Pitts, of the Royal college of architecture, London, who is representing his organization at the annual convention of the American Institute of Architects here.
