LARGE HIGHWAY PLAN OUTLINED

HOUSTON, Texas, April 24.—Linking up a chain of parks from New York to Alabama is the next step in the road building program of the United States goods roads association.

A resolution adopted by the organization here today authorized appointment of a committee to report at the next meeting upon the "desirability and feasibility of securing such a highway." The good roads campaign is to be presented in every state.

Bonds for good roads heedlessly voted by an eager public came to the front in adoption of a recommendation that the various states pass such remedial legislation as will prevent the confiscation of private property for the payment of road bonds.
