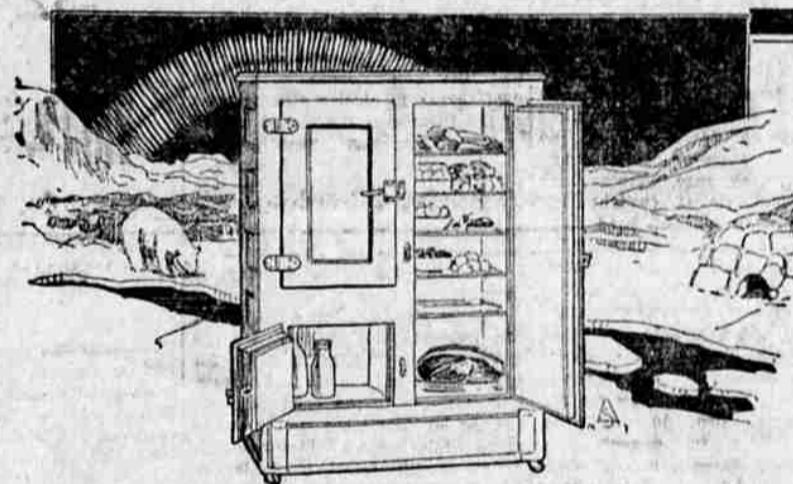

## COASTWISE LAW DECLARED GOOD

Vice-Chairman of Shipping Board Wants U. S. Vessels Only Used

WASHINGTON, Apr. 28.—An appeal for maintenance of the American coastwise laws which provide that only United States vessels may engage in commerce between United States ports was made in a radio address tonight by Vice Chairman Plummer of the shipping board.

The question was important, Mr. Plummer asserted, because one of the "avowed purposes" of the third biennial conference of the international chamber of commerce at Brussels in June is to "induce the United States to abandon its century-old policy" and throw open American coastwise trade to foreign ships.

The international chamber, according to its program will consider a resolution dealing with flag discrimination. As understood in shipping board circles the resolution will urge extension of the policy of "true equality of treatment of vessels" under whatever flag to domestic commerce.

Whatever action the chamber may take, it is understood it will carry no mandatory authority but will constitute only an expression of international policy. The meeting will be attended by Representatives of various American organizations and spokesmen for the American steamship owners' association are understood to be prepared among others to oppose the resolution.
