Harrington, hard-hitting light-

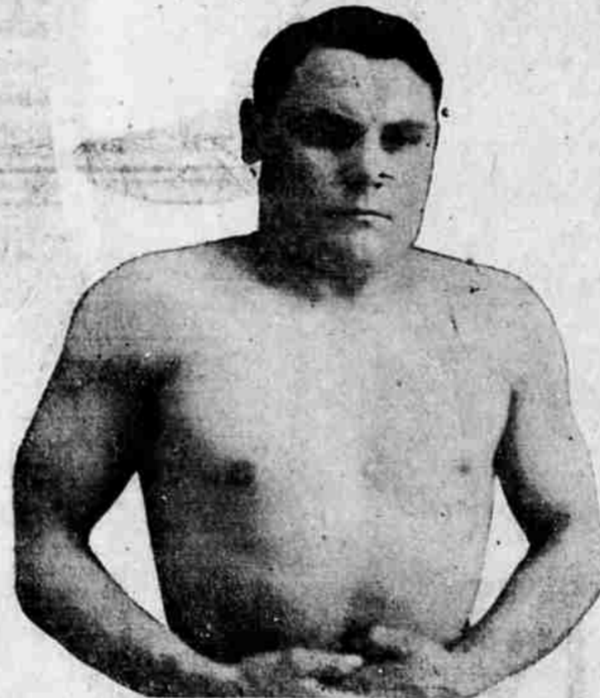
weight and Dummy Poole will tangle in another six-round tilt. Both boys have been seen in action here before and either one carries a K. O. punch that he may put across any time.
