**WORK OF OPEN AIR SCHOOL TOLD
BY KLAMATH PUBLIC SCHOOL NURSE**

One of the most interesting visits
made while in Portland was to the
Open Air School. It is not for
tuberculosis children—if they really
have tuberculosis, they are ex-
cluded. Children emaciated from
some disease, those with heart
trouble, those run down where tu-
berculosis is in the family, those
who for any reason are physically
not fit to keep ordinary school
hours and rules, are sent to this
school.

I was fortunate in finding both
Dr. Helen Cary, the school phy-
sician, and the school nurse there.
The object is to teach health hab-
its. A record of the weight of each
child is kept each week. Shower
baths are the first thing in order,
then each pupil has his own tooth
brush, and the teeth are thorough-
ly scrubbed.

The two school rooms are flooded
with fresh air from the open win-
dows, but warmed by steam heat.
Also each pupil has a sort of bath
robe to put on if he feels chilly.
The wraps are hung over steam
pipes so they will be dry and warm
when needed.

During the day folding cots are
pulled out and all take a rest. Milk
is given at mid-morning and after-

noon, while one hot dish is served
for lunch. The children are given
the menu for a week so they know
what to bring from home to supply
the right amount of calories and
vitamines.

It is a most interesting place,
showing what can be done with
proper equipment and the use of
simple health rules.

Owing to the large number of
schools allotted to each school
nurse, Portland did not have the
nursing service she desired for her
school children. During the past
year the State Tuberculosis associa-
tion has named the school board
to demonstrate intensive school
three nurses trained in public health
work. Each of these has two school
buildings under her charge and the
T. B. association pays her salary.
Three of the school principals were
present at our meeting. Each one
expressed his appreciation of their
services. Mr. Blough said "The
nurses' invasion of the school is the
biggest thing that has happened in
years." Five new schools are de-
manding the additional service for
next year. Of course the T. B. as-
sociation has no intention of con-
tinuing its part. The schools must
take the work over themselves.

life membership in a Humane So-
ciety. He succeeded in sending me
"Toy" scuttling to the curb, not
knowing whether he had sent the
life out of the little frisky animal.

Today "Toy", besides a limp, has a
sceptical outlook on life in general
and will now and forever more,
watch her step with men who turn
the wheels of the big things called
"automobiles."
