The line-up as announced is as follows: Pitchers, Bert Arnold, E. H. Hogan, Pruitt, Phillips and Sweet; infielders, Howard, Mathews, Al Norwest, H. L. Bayness, Carter, Foster, Bud Cody, Carroll, Staley and Red Watts; Catchers, Bannister and Anderson; outfielders, Foster, Cody, Carter, Staley and Ed Clarke.

Flashy Aggregation

The aggregation will prove to be one of the flashiest semi-pro teams on the coast, is the belief of experts who have witnessed try-outs on the fair grounds diamond. Such players as Bannister on the receiving end and Red Watts, who put in his first appearance yesterday afternoon, will bolster up the team decidedly.

Watts is a player with experience of many years in the old northwest league and with a little practice should make good on the short-stop position. **Fans Anxious to See Ash-
land Flash in Action
Against Good man**

Every Klamath fight fan that saw the whip lash upper cut that kayoed Wilbur Harrington last month, wants to see the author of that blow in action again. They will have their wish gratified for Maurice Harris of Ashland, the man who was responsible for one of the prettiest knockouts seen this year, will take on Young Felix Torres in the boxing-wrestling card at the Scandinavian hall Tuesday evening, May 5.

Harris is lean and wiry, cool and heady, and packs one of the hardest right crosses seen in these parts for some time. In the first round of his fight with Harrington, Harris stood off the rushes of the game Indian, with a jolting left. Suddenly Harrington left himself open, and like a flash of light the right cross was through and to the point of the chin. Harrington went down like a tree felled by an ax. He managed to last out till the middle of the second round, but a final shock punch to the jaw pulled the curtains.

Torres Shifty

Torres is a fighter unlike Harrington. He is shifty, heady, and content to stand off and jab with his left. The question among fans is, with Torres' weigh advantage and his shiftness, can he keep away from that sledge hammer right that Harris packs around with him. Another question that is puzzling fight fans is who will win in the wrestling match between Henry Burke, local light heavyweight wrestler, and Charles Deabenderfer of Dunsmuir.

Burke Old-Timer

Burke has wrestled in this city many times. He has taken them on from Ted Thye down, and many will remember how groggy Thye was from headlocks Burke clamped on him. Only by knocking Burke cold did Thye pull out of the hole. Deabenderfer is a fast and husky wrestler who has been rolling them over in northern California. Both men are training conscientiously for the match. Henry is anxious to live down his defeat at the hands of Ad Gustavo by a crushing defeat of Deabenderfer.

Fast Card

Besides the wrestling match and the Harris-Torres boxing match, there are three other boxing bouts scheduled. Wilbur Harrington, who is always dangerous until he is down and out, will fight the popular Dummy Poole at 135 pounds; Jack Crim, who is developing into one of the fittest welterweights in this section, will tangle with Kid Reigan of San Francisco; Jack Mayberry and Joe Walters will fight the curtain raiser at 170 pounds.
