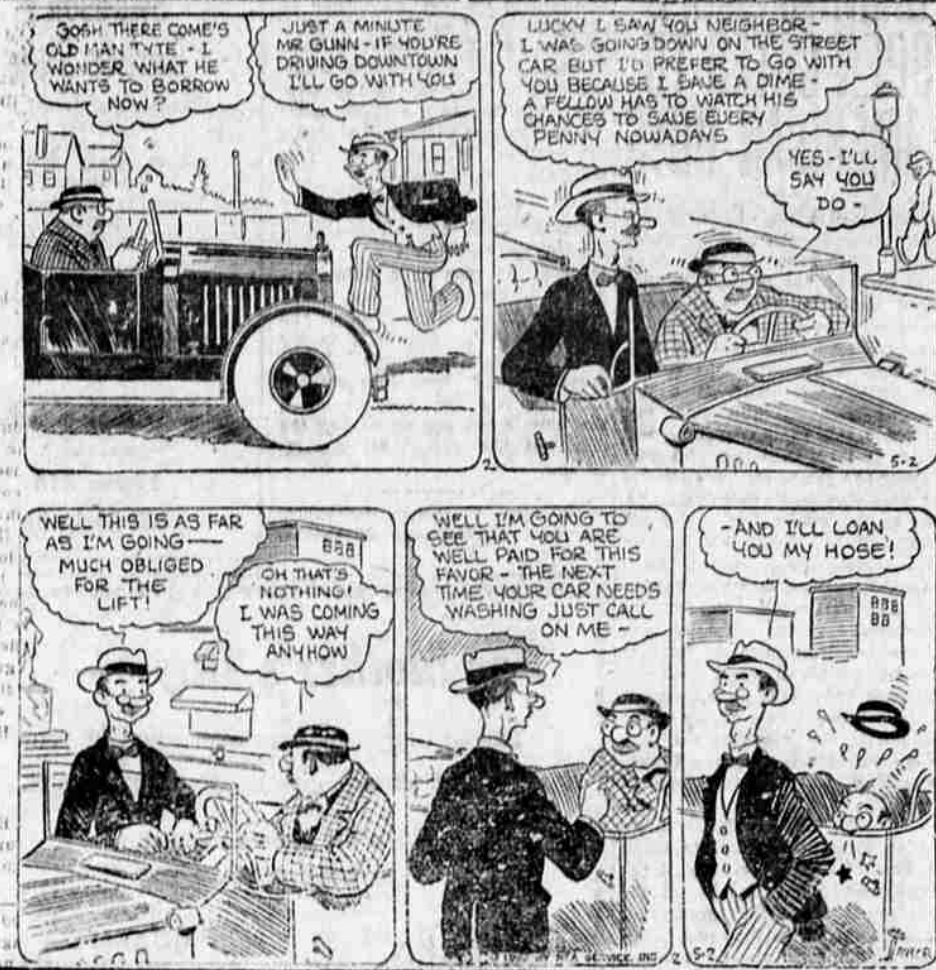

PIONEER CATTLE MAN SELLS OUT

Announcement was made last night that J. Frank Adams, pioneer cattle man of this county, had sold his 700-acre ranch, south of Merrill, to the Grassley Brothers, a dairy firm of San Francisco, for a consideration of \$70,000. The ranch sold at \$100 an acre. The Adams ranch is considered one of the fertile ranches in southern Klamath. The sale was handled by Will Adams, J. Frank Adams' son. The Grassley brothers first became interested in the land when Will Adams told them of the dairy possibilities on the Adams ranch. The Grassley brothers accompanied Will Adams to Klamath to make a personal inspection. So favorably impressed were they that financial arrangements were immediately made effecting the transfer. The California dairymen will specialize on the dairy industry and are expected to arrive in several weeks to take charge of their newly acquired holdings. Mr. Adams is still the owner of a 500-acre ranch near Adams Point.
