NINE HOLE GOLF COURSE PLANNED

Final Membership Drive to Be Started Thursday by Committee

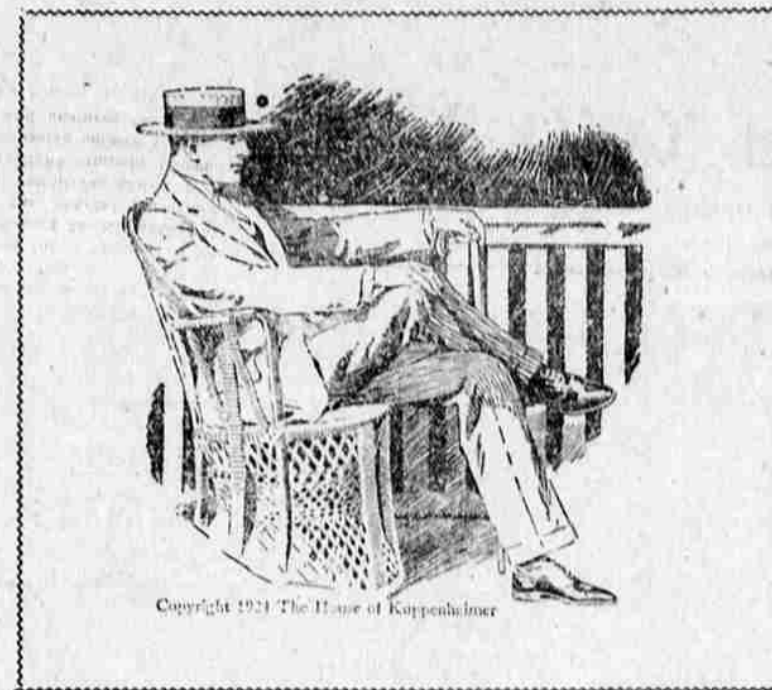
Decision as to the golf course and its location will be made on Friday evening at the general meeting of the Klamath Golf and Country club called for 7:30 p. m. in the White Pelican hotel. At this time final arrangements for the organization's perfection will be made and election of officers held.

The Reames site and two others on the Merrill road, as well as the Nuss lake land have been favored, although the general consensus of opinion seems to sway toward the selection of the Reames site. The Moore piece of property has also been mentioned at the head of Link river on the west side of the lake.

If the club decides in favor of the Reames property, according to a member of the club, a right of way may be obtained to the water, the irrigation charges will be less expensive and access to the water grade possible. The land is located one-half mile from the Keno highway, 1.4 miles from Klamath Falls. Location of the nine hole course will put practically all nine holes on the water front. With the completion of the course of 18 holes, two of the holes will be on the highway.

Conservative estimate by one of the club members sets Monday as the day when work will be started on the course. Final drive for membership fees starts Thursday with the following committee in charge: R. E. Wright, chairman; J. F. Maguire, T. P. Henderson, Jack Knowles, C. I. Roberts and C. M. Caseboom.

At present the club is not contemplating a club house until later. It was the purpose of the group to use the first 100 memberships for the installation of a golf course which will be built by Frank Nelson, golf course expert.

COUNTY TRACK MEET WILL BE HELD SATURDAY

Schools From All Districts to Be Represented at Competition

The Field and Track meet this coming Saturday will be one big picnic, so to speak, if the plans of the committee work out as scheduled. And the size of the picnic will be measured only by the numbers of fathers and mothers who accompany their children to the county fair grounds, for with every district represented the assembled crowd ought to be quite large and representative of Klamath county.

All who attend are urged to bring a basket lunch with them and to eat on the grounds, picnic fashion. For those who cannot bring their lunch an opportunity will be given to purchase it on the grounds. The Klamath Falls Parent-Teachers association has been given the concession for selling soft drinks, ice-cream, coffee and eats.

The meet is to begin promptly at 10 o'clock. Since the grade events are to be run off first, the committee in charge of events urge that all grade children be on the grounds at or before that time. Due to the large number of events that are scheduled, it will also be necessary that teachers from the various schools assist those in charge of the program by keeping their children grouped so as to be ready when called for their events. Only with this co-operation, especially that of the grade teachers, can the meet go off on scheduled time without undue delay.

Committee members who have bills to present should do so Saturday, for at the close of the meet the principals will hold a meeting to pay all bills and to draw up a final report of the finances of the association. This will be absolutely necessary, due to the nearness of the close of school when the teachers will disperse for the summer.

DISORDER BREAKS OUT AT LISBON

LISBON, Portugal, May 6.—Disorders have broken out again in Lisbon and today the streets are patrolled by cavalry, occasional revolver shots are heard, a few persons have been wounded and many arrests have been made. The disorders began Sunday night as a result of the elections.

Last night women led a street parade, followed by male demonstrators firing shots. Government troops charged the demonstrators and the troops are now awaiting reinforcements to establish order.

SCOUT MASTER PLANS TROOPS

Cecil A. Cook in Klamath County in Interest of Boy Scout Work

Organization of new scout troops in Klamath county and Klamath Falls and the appointment of scoutmasters to have charge of the newly organized troops has taken up the major portion of the ten days allotted to Cecil A. Cook, scout executive for Klamath, Jackson and Josephine counties, who is in Klamath Falls this week.

More than 50 scouts and guests turned out to the meeting the early part of the week in Legion rooms to hear the outline of work planned by Cook for the coming summer. Tentative plans for uniforms were laid and the original troop, Crater, will be outfitted first with supplies. Cook brought to Klamath Falls with him a complete set of record and registration books in order to keep complete outline of the work accomplished here.

Working on prospects, a meeting of those interested in scout work and scoutmasters are requested to appear at the chamber of commerce Thursday evening, 7:30 p. m., to discuss the summer's work. It is the hope of Cook to be able to form five troops in Klamath Falls before his ten days' stay has terminated.

In company with Rev. A. L. Rice, Cecil Cook left this afternoon at 2 p. m. for Bonanza, where Principal Lubke of the high school is in charge of the Bonanza scout troop. The neighboring troop has requested the presence of Rev. Rice and Cook in order to assist them in problems confronting them. Before his return to Medford Cook will also inspect the Algoma and Merrill troops and see in what condition they are. Survey of other Klamath county towns, not supporting scout troops, will be made with a view of formation of such organized groups.
