

NEW CAPITAL OF TURKEY SNUBBED BY BIG POWERS

LONDON, May 8.—Efforts of the Turkish government to force the principal powers to move their embassies to the new capital at Angora are not meeting with success. According to diplomatic circles in London, the powers intend to "stand pat" on their decision of some months ago to remain in Constantinople, notwithstanding the fact that Turkish officials have sent them note after note on the subject.

Angora, among the diplomats, is looked upon as a nice, quaint, antiquated mountain village, a splendid town for the wool trade and other commercial purposes, but altogether unfit as a home for ambassadors and others who are accustomed to all the comforts of civilization. The surroundings, they declare, are insanitary, and it appears the governments of all the ambassadors concerned have tacitly agreed to back up their representatives in their determination not to move.

There was talk some time ago that the German ambassador had made arrangements to have a portable bungalow sent from Berlin to Angora to serve as an embassy, but this has not as yet appeared, and the report current now is that the Germans too have entered the agreement to remain in Constantinople or its suburbs, where permanent embassies were built years ago.

TO EXCLUDE JAPS

TALAHASSEE, Fla., May 8.—A resolution calling for an amendment to the constitution to exclude Japanese from the ownership of land in Florida was adopted by the house today by a vote of 69 to 0.

Indictments Reported to Circuit Judge Leavitt This Afternoon

Among the indictments returned by the grand jury in a report to Circuit Judge Leavitt this afternoon was one against Harry Hamilton, former Klamath used car dealer, who is charged with obtaining money under false pretenses in connection with his business operations in this city.

Joe Daniels was indicted on a charge of assault with a dangerous weapon.

Mrs. Maud Reed and Frank Thomas were charged with assault with a dangerous weapon in another true bill reported by the jurors. This came as a result of a reputed fight between the pair at the auto camp grounds several weeks ago.

Lee Lewis and John Williams and John Doe Bracy were indicted for larceny. They are alleged to have robbed the warehouse of the Miller Construction company.

J. F. Lofquist was indicted on a charge of failing to support his family.

Five secret indictments were also reported.

SLUMP IN WOOL PRICE IS BIG

LONDON, May 8.—The remarkable slump in wool prices it attracting much attention, the prices having fallen 40 points in four months without much apparent cause.

The buyers, it is said, miscalculated the rate of consumption and consequently have many thousands of bales on hand, but not enough to account for the slump.

Sir Arthur Goldfinch, director of war materials during the world war, and an authority on wool is quoted as saying that the surplus is very small as compared with the average consumption, but that owing to it something like a panic now is occurring.

The Melbourne correspondent reports that a council of Australian wool brokers unanimously resolved yesterday that it was desirable to suspend all wool sales through Australia until July 1 and it was actually decided that there should be no sales in Australia for a week.
