

# WIDENING JOB ON BEND ROAD IS COMPLETED

State Highway Dept. Directs Attention to Signs and Fences

Hazardous curves, narrow cuts and narrow stretches of The Dalles-California highway between Klamath Falls and Algoma have been eliminated by the state highway department, as a result of the completion this week of the improvement project on this section of road.

The work was initiated by the highway department to better serve the heavy tourist traffic which is expected to use the road this summer.

### Pavement Job Finished

Another road job completed this week is the patching of the pavement of the same highway from the city limits south to Altamont ranch.

The state highway sign crew is now at work on the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway between Klamath Falls and Bonanza. Including the Ashland-Klamath Falls highway in Jackson county, approximately 300 signs will be erected on state highways in Klamath county. They will bear all necessary information to the motorist—proximity to a school, intersections, directions to towns, springs by the side of the road, steep grades, sharp turns, cross roads and the like.

### Signs Lower

Owing to the new head light law passed at the last state legislature, the height of the signs has been lowered to four and one-half feet above the ground, in order that the rays from the revised lights would not miss the sign.

A small crew of men was set to work yesterday on the job of repainting the highway fences on The Dalles-California highway.
