WOMAN RUNS AMUCK WHILE AT THEATER

One Person Killed and Two Wounded During Performance at Vienna
VIENNA, May 9.—One person was killed and two wounded when a woman named Mencia Carnieu, witnessing a performance of Ibsen's "Peer Gynt" at the National Theater last night fired five revolver shots at the members of her box party.
All persons hurt were Macedonians, the police said, and they attributed the shooting to a political feud. The man killed was described as Arnanovic Panizza, a member of the Macedonian federalist party. Police said the woman represented Macedonian autonomists under Moscow's direction.
