K. C. H. S. ANNUAL SOON OFF PRESS

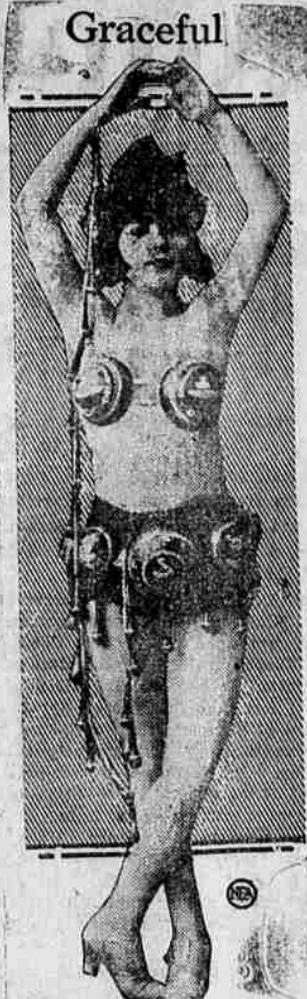
Bigger and better and testifying to infatigable work of the staff, the Klamath County High School annual is now on the press and by next week several hundred copies will be ready for distribution.
