Engineer of Hill Lines Pleads For Klamath Support

Although the interstate commerce commission might agree that potential tonnage in the Klamath country would justify the entrance of another road into Klamath, still they would hesitate to grant the Hill lines permission to enter Klamath if it were evident that Klamath Falls did not want the Hill lines to come.

This was the observation of B. V. Lintner, assistant chief engineer of the Oregon Trunk railroad, who

was here last night on a brief visit. Now is the time that Klamath should step forward and push for the new road, Mr. Lintner declared. Every agency that can be utilized for this purpose should strain every effort to make the way easy for the Hill line entrance into Klamath Falls.

Forceful denial of the rumor that surveying crews working in Klamath were merely a smoke screen to cover the real desire of the Hill lines—namely to secure a common user agreement over the S. P. lines south from Odell—was made by Mr. Lintner. "It is no bluff," he declared. "We are coming to Klamath Falls and we are going to build."

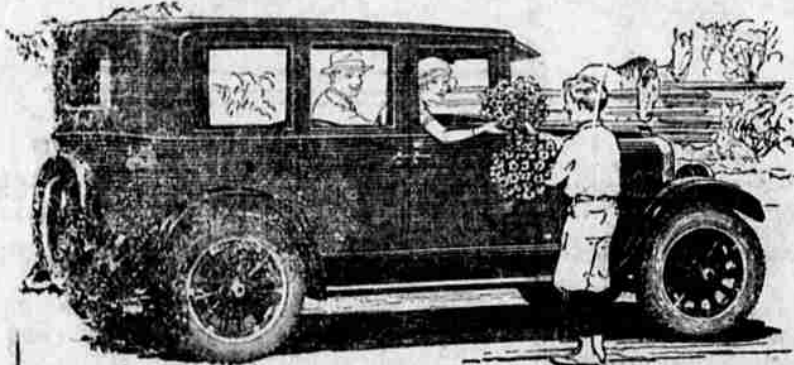
