ITALIAN ATTACK ON FASCISM HAS RAISED PROTEST

ROME, May 13.—Benedetto Croce whose position as Italy's leading philosopher and foremost intellectual figure is seldom disputed, has brought down upon himself the wrath of Fascism's leaders and has become the storm center of a vigorous controversy among publicists of culture by publishing a spirited defense of liberalism.

Rejecting the thesis that liberalism, political and cultural is dead and that the present-day struggle is solely between socialism and communism on the one hand and ultra-conservatism, reactionism and Fascism on the other, Croce, in a recent article, asserted that, Fascism notwithstanding, Italy would some day again have to turn to a liberal government and to a liberal culture.

Fascist culture, he asserted, was one-sided and superficial. Fascists were fond of talking of history and the historical significance of their cause, but they never had really learned the true lesson of history

that only a decadent state would long tolerate an authoritarian regime and that a healthy one would eventually reject it. Fascist, also never tried of taking Italian national traditions, but they realized that their extreme nationalist ideas were initiated by French nationalists like Charles Maurras and Maurice Barrès. Authoritarianism, Croce declared, was necessarily transitory and provisional, and the Fascists were again proving this to be true by the poverty of their creations.

But, Croce continued, while neither the extreme right nor the extreme left was quite sterile, each having its partial place in a national culture, liberalism was necessary to the state because it was the only creed which expressed "the necessity of giving free play, whenever possible, to the spontaneous and inventive forces of individuals and social groups," and because it was the only force which made for real mental, moral and economic progress.

The article has drawn many heated responses from Fascist leader writers, most of whom declare that Croce's arguments need no serious answers and that his influence is on the wane among younger Italians. The spokesman of the cultural aspect of Fascism condemns the philosopher's point of view as dry and pedantic, and asserts that the living force of Fascist youth will create an Italian culture much more important than that which Croce has gleaned from German philosophy. One of these answers sums up the case in the sentence: "The true work of artistic thought is born without preparation and without education."

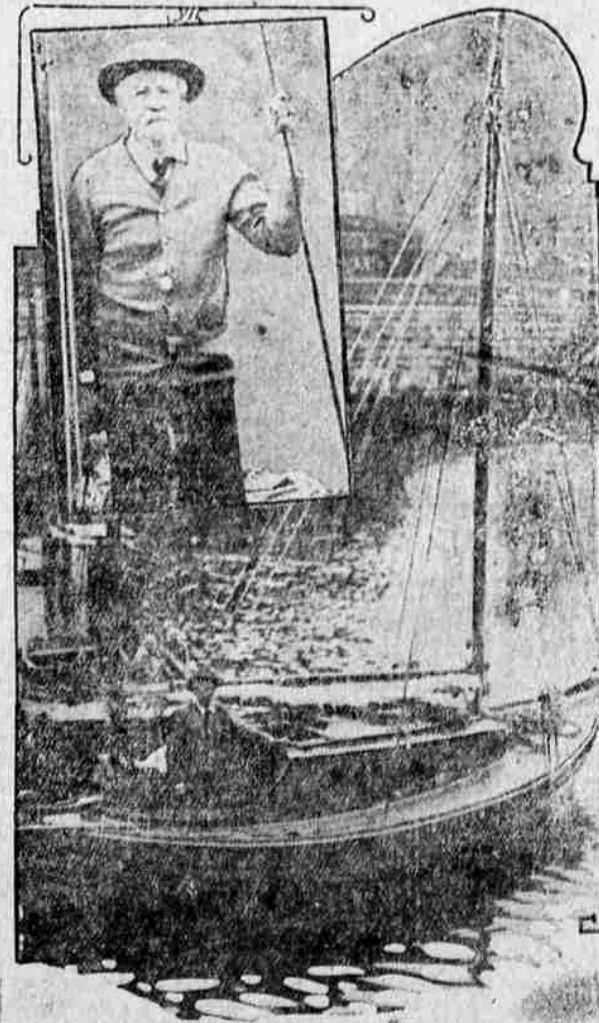
