If Burke is agreeable, it is probable that members of the Moose lodge will promote the match for some night the latter part of next week. If the match is made it undoubtedly will be one of the most hotly contested exhibitions of bone crushing ever seen in Klamath county.

FAME WON BY FIVE BROTHERS AT ATHLETICS

PIERRE, S. D., May 18.—Five brothers who have won fame in athletics give the Cooper family of Pierre claim to distinction. Kenneth Cooper, eldest of the brothers, after winning first place in rodeo exhibitions throughout the northwest for several seasons, went to the British Empire Exposition at Wembley, England, with the American rodeo delegation last summer and proved himself the outstanding artist of the troupe. He repeated his triumphs at the Madison Square Garden rodeo in New York and then turned to polo, being a member last season of the Ak-Sar-Bon team of Omaha, Neb. Norval, a younger brother, was deemed Kenneth's equal in rodeo competition until the latter eclipsed him at the Wembley and Madison Square Garden events, where both were participants. Norval has a long record of victories in state rodeo events.

Conrad is center on the University of Minnesota football team and is rated as one of the best centers in the country. Also he is heavyweight boxing champion of the University of Minnesota, a title he has held during two of his three years in school there.

Arthur, fourth of the Cooper brothers, was middleweight boxing champion at the University of Minnesota last year and is second ranking middle-weight boxer this year. Leslie, the fifth, was mentioned last season with the best high school football players of South Dakota as center for the Pierre high school team, and made his debut this season as a sprinter on the track team, with creditable high school marks in the dashes.

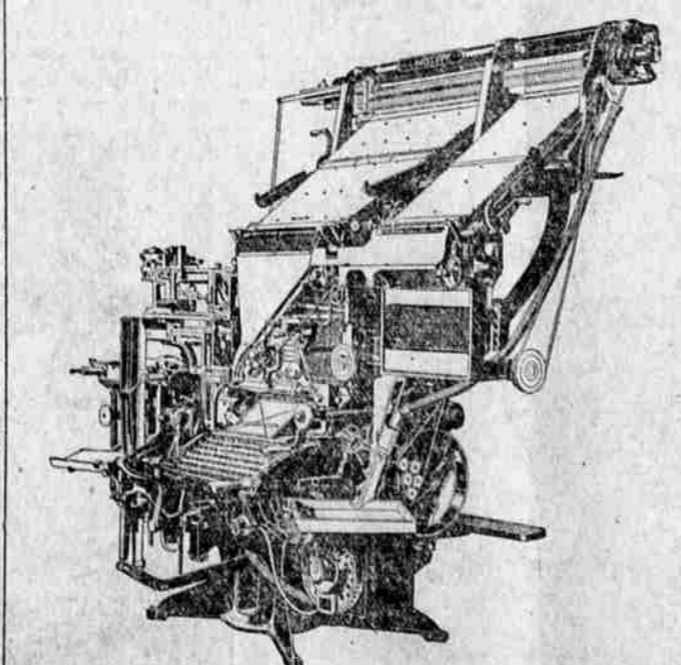

Two New Linotypes Are Added to Evening Herald Equipment



Two new linotype machines have just been added to the Evening Herald mechanical equipment, thus adding materially to the news and advertising service which this newspaper may give.

One machine a No. 19, is one of the latest Mergenthaler models, and comes equipped to set four different kinds and sizes of type. The other machine, a No. 8, is practically the same as the larger machine.

The present Linotype, referred to by Thomas A. Edison as the "eighth wonder of the world," is a line-casting machine that makes possible the composing of every form of printed matter, books, magazines, newspapers, letterheads, tickets, menus and so forth from the simplest to the most involved, at a high rate of speed and in clear-cut faces, newly cast for each occasion. And it casts an entire line at one time.

The first commercially successful Linotype was installed by the New York Tribune in July, 1886. At the end of 1924, 49,000 Linotypes were in use in sixty-three different countries, producing correct composition in half a hundred different languages. These include Syrian, Greek and even Chinese.

The Linotype has four principal matrices.

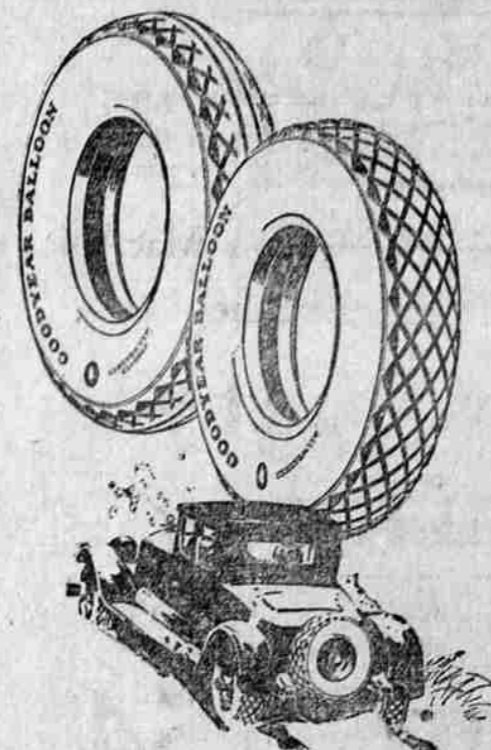
1. The keyboard and its related parts.
