

"Farmer" Vance, Who Meets Henry Burke, May 30



BURKE WILL MEET VANCE NEXT WEEK

Middleweight Wrestling Belt Will Be at Stake May 30

Henry Burke's prized middleweight championship belt will be at stake a week from Saturday night at Moose Hall when the Klamath bone-crusher meets Farmer Vance, 160-pounder, in a finish, two out of three, match.

After several days of negotiations between the two wrestlers, officials of the Moose lodge announced last night that the match is on. It will be held on a Saturday night in order to permit loggers and mill workers from outlying districts to be here.

This will be the first time in many months that Burke's belt, emblematic of the Pacific coast championship, has been at stake as heretofore he has had to meet men much heavier than himself.

Farmer Vance is known as one of the best middleweights now in the business, and Burke will have to be in perfect condition and go at top speed if he is to win the fall.

Moose lodge members were jubilant last night when they finally completed all negotiations for the bout, and they predict that one of the largest crowds that ever attended a match in Klamath Falls will be on hand to see these two men come to grips.

Burke will start intensive training tonight in order to get in good condition. With more than a week to prepare himself, he expects to be trained down to a point where he can be in better condition than for many months.

Tickets will be placed on sale within the next few days.

OSLO, Norway, May 20.—A monument to the memory of Brigadier-General Hans Hegg, the Norwegian commander of the Fifteenth Wisconsin regiment who fell at the battle of Chancellorsville, will be unveiled here this summer during the celebration of the centenary of the first Norwegian immigration to the United States.

The statue is to be erected in the township of Lier, the birthplace of Hegg. The celebration takes place in July and will be attended by King Haakon.

Intelligence Tests Given to Students

Riverside school boasts 8 of the 21 winners of the Stanford Intelligence tests given recently in all public schools of Klamath Falls which includes all students from the second grade to the eighth inclusive in the Riverside, Central, Pelican Bay, Fairview and Mills Addition schools.

Three students, according to Superintendent J. P. Wells, were picked from each grade in the city from the highest ten percent of the entrants. Riverside school came out with 8; Central with 5; Fairview with five; Pelican Bay with 2; Mills Addition with 1. In the sixth grade division, Riverside captured all first three places.

Second grade winners were Norman Hanson of Central, 28.1; Homer Knight, Riverside, 28.1; Bill Hunter, Mills Addition, 27.8.

Winners of the third grade entrants were Barbara Wales, Fairview, 36.5; Naomi Whitley, Pelican Bay, 36.4; Marie Sewell, Fairview, 35.5.

Fourth grade students winning highest three points were Katherine Chastain, Riverside, 66.5; Hilton Cornforth, Central 62.3; L. Dove Hutchens, Fairview, 59.8.

Fifth grade gave two students from Fairview the first two places. They were Ronald Gwinn, 73.2; William Perkins, 71.9; Dick Pearson, Central, third with 69.4.

Sixth grade winners were all from Riverside; Frederick Johnson, 85.2; Jean K. Bennett, 85.2; Morton Yaden, 83.6.

From the seventh grade Riverside students rated two first places. They were Ben Wilson, 98.9; Irene Murray, 95.5; George Belton, Central, 89.

Louise Hotchkins of Pelican Bay school received the highest rating of any school child in Klamath Falls when she rated 100.3 in the intelligence test given to the eighth grade. Alice Harvey of Central school received a rating of 100.1 while Junior Dennis of Riverside received 99.6 in the test.

CANADIAN PILOTS ESTABLISH RECORD FOR SAFE FLYING

OTTAWA, May 20.—Aviators in the Royal Canadian Air Force set a new record for safe flying last year by making up 3,340 hours of actual flying time without a fatal accident in carrying air mail, patrolling forests and fisheries and performing other government service, said a report from the department of the interior.

More than 3,000 acres of forest in Alberta were covered twice a day by air patrols during the season of fire hazard and in Manitoba, 40,000,000 acres were under observation. The forces photographed 40,000 square miles of terrain for the topographical survey.
