Gorman's scrapbook of newspaper clippings preceded him to town and an inspection of it at local fight headquarters revealed that he has piled up an imposing string of knockouts both in eastern and western rings. In a recent fight with Fred Fulton, a stumbling block for many, he had all the best of it, knocking Fulton down once for the count of nine.
