### Spring Ceremonial Of Hillah Temple Is Being Observed

For the first time in 20 years, Klamath Falls will be the scene of the annual spring ceremonial of Hillah Temple over this week-end. According to W. C. Van Emon, president of the Crater Lake shrine club, more than 250 guests are expected and more than 40 reservations have been wired. The guests will include visitors from Marshfield, Grants Pass, Roseburg, Ashland and Medford and surrounding cities.

Emil Britt of Jacksonville, Potentate of Hillah temple, has issued a decree to the surrounding chapters of Hillah temple to attend the spring ceremonial in Klamath Falls. At noon today more than 50 of the guests were seen in the city with red fez and black tassel.

During the ceremonial in Klamath Falls more than 25 candidates will be received into the order from the delegations arriving.

Hillah temple has concurrent jurisdiction with Al Kader temple of Portland throughout the state with the exception of Multnomah county, according to W. C. Van Emon this morning.

On Saturday morning an exhibition of the drill of drum and patrol corps will be held on Spring street opposite Big Basin Lumber company. The drum corps is from Klamath Falls while the patrol is made up of members from Ashland, Medford and Grants Pass.

During the afternoon, scheduled for 2:30, the entire temple will parade the streets, headed by the sultan. The parade, which will be made in uniform, they will go to Scandinavian hall. A banquet in the White Pelican hotel, where headquarters have been made for the conclave, is scheduled for 6 p. m. followed by a second section in the Scandinavian hall. The remainder of the evening will be spent in the hall, for ritual work and a social evening.

The executive committee in charge is composed of T. H. Simpson of Ashland, Carl Tengwald of Medford and P. B. Herman of Grants Pass. Arrangements are in charge of W. C. Van Emon, chairman and James O. Rhodes.

A truck load of scenery, costumes and stage settings was scheduled to arrive in Klamath Falls from the valley this afternoon, to give the final touches to the spring ceremonial.

**Zoological Facts About Gila Monster**—This animal was captured in Salt River Valley, Arizona. Gila monsters seldom are found because of scarcity made by long periods between reproductions. Seldom seen in circus menageries. Found only in the deserts of Arizona and New Mexico. They are supposed to be deadly poison. More so than rattle snake, maybe. Scientists are undecided. The gila monster has interlocking back-curved fangs which lock when driven into flesh. The only way the gila monster can be loosened, after striking a person, is to have the flesh cut out around the strike, otherwise both die. Generally persons bitten by gila monster, which is seldom, die from effects of the strike. Whether from the monster's poison or blood poison has not been determined. This monster takes food but once in ten to fourteen days, and a drink less often. If he had a hump in his back he would make a good camel. It's coloring is protective, and hard to distinguish in its natural habitation. Principal diet is eggs, one at a time. Scientists have estimated this gila monster to be two hundred ten (210) years of age. Each black stripe represents twenty years of life. Ladies wishing one as a novel lap or arm decoration please leave orders. This one is within an inch and seven-eighths of the longest one captured.
