NEW YORK, May 27.—Mrs. Helen Auguste Geisen-Volk yesterday pleaded not guilty in general sessions to an indictment charging first degree manslaughter for the death in February of William Winters, a six-months-old inmate of her East 86th street "baby farm." As she is held in \$36,000 bail on an indictment for child substitution the bail in the manslaughter charge was fixed nominally at \$2500.

Drum Corps To Advertise City On Trip South

Armed with 10,000 board planks, members of the fifteenth and drum corps of Klamath Falls, Hillah temple, will leave on the Saturday morning train for Los Angeles to distribute free information and publicity about Klamath Falls and Klamath county at the national convention of the Mystic Shrine. The planks were the courtesy of the Shaw-Bertram Lumber company and the printing through the courtesy of the Klamath county chamber of commerce. It is the aim of the Klamath visitors in the south, according to W. C. Van Emon, president of the Crater Lake Shrine club, to distribute the planks while en route south and in Los Angeles as well.

On one side of the planks are the words Klamath: Lakes, Land, Livestock and Lumber; An Empire Awakening. On the reverse side are the words: Hillah Temple Drum Corps, courtesy of Shaw-Bertram Lumber company and Klamath county chamber of commerce.

The Klamath men will leave Saturday morning to join the special Hillah train at Weed, which is made up in Medford. About 75 or 80 men are expected to make the trip to Los Angeles.

Those making up the drum corps are J. O. Rhodes, captain; R. E. Crego, Ray Dunn, A. L. Wishard, I. J. Struble, Dr. Coe; bugle corps is composed of Hans Nylander, E. J. McLaughlin, N. G. Wheeler and A. E. Peasley.

AT THE PINE TREE

If you want to laugh, if you want to have vividly recalled to mind the exciting, stirring events of 1917, if you find a place in your heart for humanness and the love that is devotion in its highest sense, then by no means miss "Friendly Enemies," the George Melford production, which is the feature tonight at the Pine Tree theater.

It is a picture in which the spirit of Americanism is strong throughout, a play that tugs at the heart-strings even as it calls forth bursts of merriment provoked by the restrained comedy of Weber and Fields, the comedy team that has been rocking the world in its antics for half a century.

AT THE LIBERTY

"Abraham Lincoln," the picture which has been the sensation of the movie world, is announced this week as a First National picture, to be shown at the Liberty theater tonight.

"Abraham Lincoln" was more than two years in the making, and at times as many as 2500 people appear in the cast. It deals with the life of Lincoln from his birth, through his boyhood, the presidency and the strife of the Civil war, depicts the surrender of Lee and shows life in Washington after the war and finally his assassination.

The production has been hailed as an artistic and dramatic sensation by the national press and is generally conceded to be one of the most important pictures ever brought to the screen.

Allan Body Sent North For Burial

The body of A. M. Allan, member of the Oregon Trunk railroad survey crew, who was killed early Sunday morning in an automobile crash on the state highway near Olene, was shipped this morning to Bellingham, Washington where funeral services and interment will take place. The victim of the tragedy is survived by a wife and infant son.

TIMBERMEN BUY PHONE LINE AS FIRE SAFEGUARD

Purchase of the Klamath Telephone and Telegraph company line from Aspen lake to Klamath Falls and rebuilding of 75 miles of the system in the western part of the county will guarantee the Klamath Forest Protective association an independent telephone system that will assure greater fire protection of forests of Klamath, Jack Kimball secretary of the association announced this morning.

Arrangements have been made through Mr. Kimball for the purchase of the local telephone line, owned by John Hessig of Chiloquin. However Mr. Hessig will be allowed to use the line pending construction of his new telephone line to Rock creek, along the new Rock creek highway.

The rebuilt lines will be routed as follows: Fredenburg Springs, to Potters Mill to Spencers ranch to Clover creek to Aspen lake where a connection will be made with the newly acquired line purchased from Hessig.

In place of the No. 12 and 14 wire which has been used on the line in the past, No. 8 wire is being installed which will assure better service.

Alaska Will Have Airplane Service

PRINCE RUPERT, B. C., May 27.—An airplane for freight service between Wrangell, Alaska, and the Cassiar gold mining district arrived here from Portland, Ore., yesterday. Five days, including two stops, were consumed on the trip. Gold was discovered in the Cassiar over winter and a stampede is in progress.

Heppner Fire Loss Fixed At \$25,000; Flames Controlled

PENDLETON, Ore., May 27.—A fire that caused a property damage estimated at \$25,000 started this morning in the Schwarz Meat Market at Heppner, according to reports received here and before it was extinguished destroyed or badly damaged several business establishments. The blaze was finally placed under control about 9:30.

over the head with a gun." That was all he said. He lapsed into unconsciousness.

Hawkins Testifies Sheriff Hawkins told briefly Way's side of the case as the accused man had told him.

According to Way's story as recounted by Hawkins, Way knocked Murphy down three times with his fist and then after the fight was over helped him onto his horse.

Way denied having struck Murphy with anything but his fist, although he admitted having a Lueger revolver in his possession at the time of the fight. He told the story of the fight to the authorities voluntarily Sheriff Hawkins said.

Way did not testify on his own behalf. Nor was he there at the inquest.

Sidney Lyons, employe of Murphy, told the coroner's jury that on Saturday morning he met Way out on the flat, near the Murphy sheep camp. Way wanted to know where Timothy Murphy was and Lyons told him. A few minutes later Lyons saw Murphy talking to Way, Lyons testified. He did not see the fight in the Devil's Garden country.

Manning vs. Stone Only a few attended the inquest. Horace Manning, who has been retained to act as special prosecutor in the murder case and C. F. Stone, who will defend Way were present at the inquest to get a perspective

of the legal battle that will be fought out next month in the courts.

The jury was composed of James H. Driscoll, Charles Johnson, L. E. Crawford, L. G. Hoagland, Roy Durbin and S. E. Sullivan.
